Thank you to the many parents who were able to attend yesterday's combined Ash Wednesday/Opening School Mass. It was a wonderful celebration of faith and of our Christ centred community at St Angela's. Appreciation to Mrs Turner, our Religious Education Coordinator, for her excellent work in co-ordinating our celebration and to the staff for their efforts in making the morning so special. Thank you also to Fr Alejandro for his blessings for a fruitful year ahead and encouraging us to 'always develop our relationship with Christ'.

Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent. During this Liturgical season of the Church, children and adults may sometimes ask the question: "What is Ash Wednesday?" The ashes used are made by burning the remains of the palms blessed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance (sackcloth and ashes). They also remind us of our mortality ("remember that you are dust"). Being marked with ashes at the beginning of Lent indicates our recognition of the need for deeper conversion of our lives during this season of renewal. During Lent, the Church asks us to contemplate ongoing conversion. To achieve conversion, the Church proposes the practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

It is the focal point of the Church's liturgical year. It occurs forty days before Good Friday. We are reminded to be faithful to the Gospels. Believing in the Gospels helps us to walk with Jesus. We can be

guided along this journey by such Gospel values as Love, Hope, Trust, Service, Forgiveness, Peace, Respect, Acceptance, Compassion and Justice.

Our Kindergarten and new families to the school enjoyed a wonderful night of community and hospitality last Friday afternoon at our welcoming BBQ. A wonderful time was had by all but in particular the children (see more in this Shine).

My appreciation and thanks to the many parents who attended the Kindergarten and Year 1 grade evenings. The combined Year 2 to 6 general information parent session will be held tomorrow morning at 8:45am. We hope you can join us. Your support is very much appreciated. On your behalf many thanks to all the teachers for their time and commitment to working with you. It is working in partnership that we value, as it truly benefits your child's learning.

Next Tuesday evening we look forward to seeing you at the Parent Teacher Interviews. These will be held in the hall. These interviews provide an opportunity for you to meet and discuss your child's needs with their teacher. Parents know their children better than anyone else and sharing this knowledge gives teachers a valuable resource to assist them in progressing your child's learning. Bookings are undertaken online. Information was sent home via email and hard copy on Tuesday.

I ask you to continue keeping in your prayers Mrs Ogilvie, Mrs Hemmings and their respective families due to the loss of their fathers who both passed into external life last Friday. As emailed earlier this week, their funerals will be held tomorrow.

Luke 4:1-13 Lent can be a time of spiritual growth

When our Lord was tempted by Satan, He found Himself in the same conflict that Adam (and all other human beings ever since) was faced with at the beginning: namely, to obey God's command or to give in to Satan's suggestion of disobedience. It is the time of a new creation, one in which the Father (through His Son) will bring about the final triumph of good over evil, of life over death. St. Mark here portrays Jesus as the obedient Son who remained in the right relationship with God throughout the period of temptation. We too, especially in this Lenten season, are called to the same stance of obedience, to live each day in a correct relationship with our heavenly Father by imitating the fidelity of Jesus Christ. In this way, we come to share in His victory over temptation and we grow stronger in our own faith, hope and love.

Important Allergy Information

At St Angela's we have a number of children who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for some people the reaction can be life-threatening. This is called anaphylaxis and can occur in minutes of an exposure to a trigger, in these children's case, nuts.

We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these children. So as to support our community's effort in this regard, parents are requested not to send nuts or foods containing nuts to school with their children.

The following list gives examples of such foods.

- Peanuts, hazelnuts, almonds, cashews, macadamia nuts
- Peanut butter
- Nutella
- Biscuits and cakes containing nuts
- Snack packs containing nuts
- Chocolate bars containing nuts eg Picnics, Mars Bars (almond), Nut Breaks and Fruit and Nut chocolates
- Marzipan and nougat
- Breakfast cereals containing nuts eg Crunchy Nut/Honey Nut Cornflakes, Muesli, Nutrigrain
- Muesli Bars and snack bars containing nuts
- Yoghurt and nut mixer packs
- Confectionary items such as Lolly Gobble Bliss Bombs and Rocky Road
- Uncle Toby's yoghurt muesli bars

We realise that there may be trace elements of nuts in a variety of other foods. However, if you use the above list as a guide you will be doing your part. Parents can also reinforce with their children that sharing food is not allowed at St Angela's.

If you have any concerns or questions please contact the school. Thank you for your support and understanding in helping us cater to the health needs of all of our children.

Birthday Treats

Celebrating a birthday is something all children look forward to! If your child wishes to bring a treat to school to share with their friends (purely optional), we kindly ask that you send cupcakes or donuts in. Cupcakes or donuts are preferred as they are easy to hand out and are a treat that all children enjoy. Due to a multitude of allergies present, we ask that you do not send lollies, chocolates or other treats in. Similarly at Easter or Christmas, we ask that you do not send lollies, chocolates or candy canes in.

If your child has allergies, you are welcome to send some cakes in for your child, which we will be kept in the freezer in the staffroom and given out as necessary.
