Dear Parents.

Our Lenten Journey

I encourage you, as a family, to discuss the Gospel values of Love, Hope, Trust, Service, Forgiveness, Peace, Respect, Acceptance, Compassion and Justice as listed in last week's Shine and how they translate into our everyday relationships and attitudes. You are very much a model of these Gospel values towards others and in particular your children in your daily actions. They witness and learn from your love, respect and forgiveness of others, your relationships and your faith

Never underestimate the difference you can make to others, whether it is a kind word, a helping hand, a prayer, a positive attitude etc.

Always consider that for many of the people you meet or interact with in your everyday life, you may be the only face of Jesus they meet that day. In a world where values, love and forgiveness are sometimes lost to self interest, negativity and materialism there is never a more important time as the present, as St Francis said, **preach the Gospel every day, even if sometimes you have to use words**.

Working in Partnership

Appreciation and thanks to you, our wonderful parents, for your attendance at the parent teacher interviews on Tuesday. It was wonderful to see the teachers and parents working in true partnership with the children as the priority. Thank you to our dedicated staff for giving so generously of their time to meet with you. The hall was certainly a buzz of activity.

Getting to Know Your Child

At St Angela's, assessment of the children's learning plays an important role in ensuring that teaching is matched to the children's

learning needs. When assessing, the teachers collect, analyse and record information about the children's progress in their learning. While assessment occurs across all grades throughout the year, we place a particular focus on the early years of their formal schooling.

Over the first few weeks of this term the Kindergarten and Year 1 teachers have been assessing the children's literacy and numeracy abilities. Kindergarten and Year 1 children also complete the Literacy Early Years Assessment (EYA) and the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI). Additionally, Years 2-6 along with other literacy assessments complete an MAI. These assessments allow the teachers to individually assess each child, learn about how they think, and to find out what they know and can do in literacy and numeracy. The information gathered from these assessments assists the children's teachers to plan learning experiences that best support the children's abilities and needs. So that the children's growth in their learning can be measured and monitored, many of these assessments will be administered again at the end of the school year.

Sunday, Feb 21st 2015 Year C 2nd Sunday in Lent



It is always good to be present when someone changes before our eyes

Can you remember a time when someone or something changed before your eyes and you saw goodness and beauty there that you never saw before, and you were deeply moved? It could be the beauty of nature: a river, a lake or the ocean, a sunrise, a sunset or the stars in a clear night sky. At a particular moment, and completely unexpectedly, as you look at one of these you are deeply touched; you can say to yourself what St Peter said at the Transfiguration: "it is good for me to be here."

Or it could be the goodness and beauty of a person that suddenly **shines** out for you. It may be someone close to you who normally seems so ordinary, yet at a special moment is changed before your eyes and the person's wonderful beauty **shines** out. Parents may have this experience at the birth of their children or as they see them on First Communion day, all dressed up and glowing with wonder and excitement. At such moments they know that all the sacrifices they make for their children are well worthwhile. CHANGING GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:30am until 2:50pm, with a 5 minute dismissal zone, and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. Appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made. We ask that all early departures and changes to going home advised are in writing arrangements stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au before 2.30pm. children will only be called to the office when you arrive to collect them. We ask that you do not contact the office requesting your children be ready and waiting for your arrival as delays in traffic etc. may result in children waiting for long periods.

Have you returned your medication forms?

Thank you to those parents who have returned St Angela's forms and action plans if your child has medication stored or administered at school due to anaphylaxis, allergies or asthma. If you have not updated your paperwork, please do so as a matter of importance. If you require forms to be resent, please contact the school office. If your child no longer requires medication to be stored at school, please email the school at stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au and we will remove your child's name from our records. It is essential that these forms and action plans are updated annually by your child's doctor so that our records are accurate and reflect the needs of each individual child. As noted, it is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child's medication remains current, ie. not expired. Please note this in a diary or on your phone. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.

Medical Bracelets

An email has been sent today to all our families whose children suffer from anaphylaxis, allergies, asthma, diabetes and heart conditions regarding the ordering of medical bracelets. If you did not receive this note, please contact the office. In the interests of your child/children's safety, please note the wearing of medical bracelets is **compulsory** at St Angela's.

School Fee Statements

School Fee statements were mailed out by the Catholic Education Office (CEO) last week. CEO have advised that Australia Post's delivery times have changed, which may cause a delay in some families receiving their Term 1 statements. This could be an extra 1-3 business days in most cases. CLASS PARENT REPRESENTATIVES
