The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Year B

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26_Feast speaks volumes about Jesus' "divine love"

In 2009, Pope Benedict XVI called attention to the observance of the feast of Corpus Christi in many parts of the Catholic world. The then-Pontiff said it was linked to the other feasts nearby in the liturgical calendar -- Easter, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday.

This feast, the Pope explained, "speaks to us of divine love -- of what it is and what it does." The love of God "transforms all things," he continued. For that reason the faithful organise processions, carrying the Eucharistic Lord into their cities.

The Blessed Sacrament, the Pope said, gives the faithful the strength to continue the mission of the Church. "We all need this Bread, because the journey toward freedom, justice, and peace is long and tiring."

From the Year 4 Mass on Thursday 28th May · 'The Bread of Life':

We live in a world of signs.

A light on in a dark house means someone is at home. A handshake is a sign of greeting and friendship. A flag is the sign of a nation.

Jesus wanted to leave a sign of His presence amongst us. He told us that whenever his friends meet and break bread, he would be present. The breaking of bread, which happens at every Mass is a sign of God's presence here and now and also challenges us to share our lives with God for his people.

If you are ever unsure about any school event, activity, procedure, learnings or in particular anything that may have involved your child etc. you are encouraged to please take the time to seek clarification, as your first port of call with the school i.e. with class teachers, the office, Mrs Fitzalan or Mr Calabria to get information first hand as opposed to relying on heresay or other's interpretations or perceptions.

Please also note it is never appropriate to approach other school children for clarification of an issue or event etc. Matters are always best handled by the teachers and school. Additionally, contacting other parents who you do not know well to discuss children's friendships etc is not always beneficial.
