#### A-E Mid Year Reports

Very soon, your child will be bringing home their Semester One Learning Report. These Reports highlight particular strengths, as well as areas of development for your child.

In 2014, St Angela's was a Pilot school for the new FACES Administrative System for the Diocese. One component of this system was the new REPORTING feature. In June and December last year, a FACES report was distributed for each student in Years 1-6. This year, as identified in last week's SHINE, Kindergarten students will also receive a FACES report. We thank parents for the positive feedback received in 2014 as we implemented the new system.

An A-E style of reporting is mandated by the Government for all grades except Kindergarten (who have a different Reporting scale).

\*There are no predetermined number of A, B, C, D, E achievement levels to be allocated

\*Each Key Learning Area must have an overall achievement level indicated

\* It is important to note than this reporting process is not based on a bell curve.

\*The overall achievement level is for the whole Key Learning Area (KLA) which may contain many strands. Although some KLA's have been broken into strands, it is important to note that some strands have more weight than others. The overall achievement is not just a straight averaging of strands.

\*Comparative data for the grade is included in the reports for Years 1-6. \*The achievement levels / common grade scale are provided by the Board of Studies

\*Parent/Teacher interviews will be held in Week 10 to supplement and further explain reports.

Each year introduces different concepts, content units and skills etc. which can increase in difficulty from the year before. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement level in a particular Key Learning Area may change.

The achievement level of 'C' is awarded to children who have achieved sound knowledge and understanding of work covered in that particular grade at this particular time. It means your child is working and achieving appropriately for their grade. This may be different from the traditional 'C' from our own school days. Our parent/teacher interviews seek to explain, elaborate on and support the Reports. The following website http://arc.boardofstudies.nsw.edu.au/go/k-6/ provides worksamples that illustrate A-E Achievement levels. It is well worth a look.

### Parable about a seed helping the disciples to grow in confidence

Jesus used parables to try to help people to catch glimpses of what the Kingdom of God is like. His great gift was to use everyday things - people were familiar with them but were taught to see things in a new light. Farming people would have seen the seasonal miracle of seeds being sown and plants growing, seemingly of their own accord. As well, there was the mustard seed, the smallest of seeds, growing into the largest of trees providing shelter for birds. Everyday things that people could hold in their hands take their imaginations into something far greater. Though short, the parables have layers of meaning and give people food for thought long beyond their telling. It is possible that every time people sowed seeds, the parable would be brought to mind and people would gain a new insight or simply marvel that the seed in their hand was a symbol of the eternal Kingdom.

Each year introduces different concepts, content units and skills etc. which can increase in difficulty from the year before. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement level in a particular Key Learning Area may change. Comparative data for Years 1-6 is included with your child's report as per Diocesan Policy.

This style of reporting mandated by the Government involves a great deal of processing before arriving at an achievement level for each Key Learning Area. There are many assessments undertaken, work samples examined, observations made and needs discussed. In Week 10, teachers will be having parent interviews to support, discuss and complement these reports, affirm your child's learning and to give direction / focus for future learning.

Together the school and you form an important partnership. This partnership supports your children in reaching their potential so that home and school are united in their approach.

Many thanks to our dedicated teachers for always making themselves available to you. Our teachers here at St Angela's are a truly gifted team of Educators. They themselves are committed learners who strive to provide quality Catholic Education for our students. The role of the teacher is never easy, it is a challenge but it is without doubt one of the most rewarding careers. Teachers not only work with the children who are our future, but are part of the Church's mission in passing on our Gospel values. The commitment, passion and care our teachers and staff bring to their vital role is what helps make our school so great.

# St Angela's Athletics Carnival 2015

All members of the St Angela's community are invited to attend the Athletics Carnival on Friday 19th June. All the children have been training hard for their events and are looking forward to the carnival. Below are a few reminders to help with the smooth running of the day:

- All 800m competitors must be at the oval AH Whaling Reserve at 8:15am.
- All children in Years 3-6 need to be at school before 8.30am. Buses will be leaving school for Roxborough Park at 8:40am sharp.
- PE uniform is to be worn. Children may wear a coloured shirt that corresponds with their colour house. School hat only must be worn. Children do not need to bring their school bags, excursion bags would be more suitable.
- Years 3-6 will need to bring recess and lunch with them. Extra drinks should be brought, especially water.
- Spikes may be worn but they must be put on in the marshalling area only and must be removed at the completion of the event.
- Please make sure all belongings are clearly labelled.
- We ask that all parents stay off the field at all times. Any enquiries can be made at the announcing table, not the recording station. Individual results will not be given out on the day. Parent helpers only are allowed to be inside on the oval.
- It will be much appreciated if all spectators/parents follow these viewing guidelines. This will allow everyone to enjoy watching the children. It will also ensure the children's safety and that children do not miss their events and that the events run smoothly.
- This year, only a cake stall and coffee van will be present for the parents.
- Children must have their name marked off with their teacher before leaving the athletics ground.
