25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B Mark 9:30-37 Called to respond with compassion A very engaging scene follows the earlier discussion between Jesus and the disciples. They are still "inside the house", an open house where all are welcome. Jesus places a little child in their midst. Who is this child? The child is unnamed. We might give this child a name so that she or he is a real person for us. Jesus seemingly gathers the twelve in a circle around him. Taking the child in his arms, he tries to show them that gospel leadership resides, not in privilege, but in the welcome offered to those whose voices are rarely heard and whose needs are frequently ignored. Jesus, the suffering messiah, actually identifies with a defenceless child, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." His identification with the defenceless is as intimate as his identification with God, "the one who sent me." As a church, we might well hear today's gospel story as a call to respond with compassion and justice to those who have suffered the indignity

and injustice in their childhood. We might hear it as an invitation to listen to the cry of our sisters and brothers who continue to seek the dignity and justice that belong to all of God's people. From a reflection on the Gospel by Sr Veronica Lawson RSM

Home School Learning Link

Sure-fire tips to getting kids to help at home!

Here are some ideas to keep in mind as you develop your family into a team of helpers:

- Give children realistic jobs rather than task that simply keep them busy. Kids can sense it when parents give them jobs to keep them busy. Make sure the jobs you give make a real contribution to the family's well-being.
- Balance the personal chores with family jobs. Involve children in choosing their jobs. Rotate the unpleasant tasks frequently.
- Place the more arduous or difficult tasks on a roster. The children can refer to it when needed, which takes the load off you and removes the need to remind them.
- Use grandma's principle* to ensure their helping jobs are done. That is, make sure jobs are completed before mealtimes and pleasant activities such as watching television.
- Avoid doing jobs for children. When children get the message that no one will do their jobs for them they will be more likely to help out.
- Show your appreciation for their help. Let them know that their contribution to the family is valued. If you do it often enough they may even show their appreciation for your help in return!
- Make sure they do the whole job, not half a job. Don't accept half-hearted efforts or half-completed jobs. If you think your child is capable of putting the cat food back in the fridge and placing the spoon in the dishwasher then insist that he or she does the whole job. That is what is valued in the world of work, which they will eventually enter.
- Rebrand the term 'chore' as 'help'. The term 'chore' definitely has an image problem. Mention the word and children turn up their nose in horror. Use the term 'help' as it is easier on the ear and really does indicate what you want from your children.

*Grandma's principle – putting activities in the right order. You get the bad things (making your bed) out of the way before you do the good things (watching TV or playing games).

Keep in mind:

Separate helping at home from pocket money. Expect them to help without being paid. Children can do a mixture of self-help activities and family jobs. Use rosters to place responsibility onto children to remember.
