
Imagination does not always allow us to cope with invitation

The rich man had received an answer he didn't expect. It was an answer he couldn't cope with. He turned away because he had too many other possessions. He probably hoped to be asked to be a benefactor, maybe to enable Jesus' work through philanthropy. The young man of the Gospel was flawed because the invitation was outside his imagination. He wanted the idea of spiritual growth without cost to himself. He sought spiritual riches but couldn't cope with the loss of earthly riches. Jesus then addressed his disciples. "If you're rich it's hard to be a kingdom person." Jesus didn't say "impossible". Just hard. We then have the wonderfully exaggerated picture of pushing a camel through a needle, a kind of verbal cartoon. It had the desired effect. The disciples were overwhelmed. They ventured the opinion that the membership of the kingdom would be quite small. This is an important understanding because the disciples recognised that possessions come in all shapes and sizes. They don't even have to be material. Peter was quick to point out that some of them had already put aside everything. Jesus then tells them that the ability to be a follower comes from God who will give the strength needed.

Shoe boxes will be sent to some of the poorest countries in the

Shoe boxes will be sent to some of the poorest countries in the world as a Christmas gift to children. One of the wonderful things about the shoebox is that the whole family can get involved with the preparation.

Please decide on the sex and the age of the child you wish to sponsor. The age categories are: 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old and 10-14 years old. Here are some suggestions:

A cuddly toy, dolls, a wrapped bar of soap and a flannel, a toothbrush, toothpaste, crayons, felt pens, pencils with pencil sharpener, a hat, cap, small musical instrument, a small ball or tennis ball, jewellery, hair bands, clip-on earrings, toy cars or trucks, clothes, etc.

<u>Please do not include</u> chocolates or other foods that could melt or perish. War related items (toy guns, soldiers), medicines or anything liquid or sharp, are also prohibited.

Place the items inside a box and deliver it to the parish office. Remember to stick a label to the lid of the box to show the gender and age of the child for whom the gift is intended.

You can bring the boxes to the Church on a weekend or drop them off at the parish office by 1 November 2015.

Understanding, Tolerance and Inclusion Reflection

As always, parents teach by example

- Notice your own attitudes.
- Remember that children are always listening. Be aware of the way you talk about people who are different from yourself. Do not make jokes that perpetuate stereotypes.
- ♦ Select books, toys, music, art, and videos carefully.
- Point out and talk about unfair stereotypes that may be portrayed in media
- Answer children's questions about differences honestly and respectfully. This teaches that it is acceptable to notice and discuss differences as long as it is done with respect.
- Acknowledge and respect differences within your own family. Demonstrate acceptance of your children's differing abilities, interests, and styles. Value the uniqueness of each member of your family
- Help your children feel good about themselves.
- Honour your family's traditions and teach them to your children
