I wish to inform our Parish School Community that Mrs Turner (4 Yellow class teacher and Religious Education Coordinator) will be taking long service leave from the end of Term 2 until the end of the year and then will officially retire after an amazing teaching career of over two decades, of which the last 13½ years have been at St Angela's.

Mrs Turner has made an enormous contribution to St Angela's both in her teaching and in her leadership role. We will indeed miss her as she takes a well earned break from full time work to enjoy travelling, her grandchildren and the finer things in life. We will formally farewell her closer to the end of this term.

Lest We Forget 101 Years

The Anzac tradition was forged 101 years ago on 25 April 1915, when the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

It marked the start of a campaign which lasted eight months and resulted in some 26,000 Australian casualties, including 8,159 who were killed or died of wounds or disease. The bravery and spirit of those who served on the Gallipoli Peninsula shaped a legend, and so the 'Anzac' became a part of the Australian and New Zealand lexicon. In 1916, the first anniversary on the landing was observed in Australia, New Zealand, England and by troops in Egypt. That year, 25 April was named 'Anzac Day'. By the 1920's, Anzac Day ceremonies were held throughout Australia and the states had designated Anzac Day as a public holiday. Commemoration of Anzac Day continued throughout the 1930's and 1940's with World War II veterans joining parades around the country.

Over the ensuing decades, returned Australian servicemen and women from conflicts such as Malaysia, Vietnam, Korea, East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan as well as peacekeepers and veterans from allied countries, now march proudly in the parades.

Newbury, for co-ordinating yesterday's reflective Anzac Day ceremony. The children respectfully and reverently presented this significant ceremony for parents, teachers and the student body. Thank you once again to all involved and those who attended. Special thanks to Flight Lieutenant, Frank Di Stefano (Luke Di Stefano - 2 Yellow), from the Royal Australian Air Force who addressed the children. During the prayer, we remembered all those who died defending our country during the wars which Australia has been



involved in this century. As has been tradition here at St Angela's after the service each child enjoyed an Anzac biscuit.

Religious Education

Sixth Sunday of Easter, Year C May 1st 2015



John 14: 23-29

Jesus promises his disciples that the Father will send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit.

As in last week's gospel, we read this Sunday from the words of Jesus at the Last Supper in the Gospel of John, the so-called 'farewell discourse'. The theme of 'love' emerges again, not the love of one disciple for another, but the disciple's love for Jesus. Love for Jesus brings down the love of the Father. This love is shown by 'keeping the word' of Jesus, and keeping the word of Jesus is keeping the word of the Father who sent him. Jesus draws us into intimacy with the Father. Fidelity to the word of Christ is not easy. Aware that the disciples will need assistance to recall and practise his word, Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit 'will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said'. To live as Christians requires this remembering of all that Jesus said and did, but also openness to the new insights provided by the Spirit, who is constantly active in the Church. The Spirit is given the name 'Advocate', in Greek parakletos, which means one who is 'called alongside', one who is called to assist. John alone uses this term for the action of the Spirit. The final verses speak of 'peace', the peace that the world cannot give. The departure of Jesus to the Father 'who is greater than I' should not undermine the peace of the disciples, for they already know the Father's closeness through Jesus. We pray for those who preach Christ's word and that we may be receptive to the work of the Spirit, called to assist us by Jesus.
