## Luke 12:13-21 Parable of the rich man with a good harvest

The Gospel reading this week fits in very well with this Year of Mercy in which we find ourselves. The theme this week is the obstacle wealth can be to us entering fully into a relationship with God. The valuing of riches above all else and the constant desire for more is what is problematic, not actually being wealthy. What good is served by one person having more than they need while others do not have enough to meet their needs? Jesus' message in this parable is to share what we have with those in need. Pope Francis has declared this year the Year of Mercy and calls on us to reflect deeply on the wonderful gift of mercy that comes to us from our Heavenly Father. He calls on us to consider those ways in which we are called to be the face of mercy to those we meet each day, just as Jesus did in His telling of the parable of the rich man.

How could we in our local community better strive to live out this gospel message?

#### **First Eucharist**

Last week the First Eucharist Parent Information Evening was held at Our Lady of the Rosary. We wish the children every blessing as they begin their journey towards receiving Jesus for the first time.

#### **Catholic Mission Workshops**

Tomorrow, Year 5 and 6 will be participating in Mission workshops Sacrament of Confirmation (Year 6) and Haves and have nots (Year 5). The children will explore relevant global issues and the work of Catholic Mission, understanding that they can be part of the work of mission by taking action.

### COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Education Act 1990 requires your child to attend school each day that instruction is provided, unless they are sick or there is another good reason for their inability to attend. Parents are required to explain their child's absence within the following seven days. Not doing so means that an unjustified absence will be recorded on the class roll. Teachers are also required to record lateness and part day absences on the class roll. If your child is late, or if you pick your child up during the school day, you are required to come in to the office for your child to be signed in/out.

## School Census Day - Friday 5th August

**Friday 5th August** is School Census Day. All children should attend school on this day and absence should only be if it is absolutely necessary.

If you know your child will be away on Friday 5th August, please email stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au advising the reason for the absence and when they will return, otherwise, simply respond to the text sent from St Angela's on the day by 10.00am explaining their absence and their date of return to school.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however, Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education.

- Timing: 3-4 minutes
- Stance: poised, comfortable, confident
- Topic Interest: Audience attention, appropriate level
- Voice: clarity, variety, loudness, pitch
- Speech Cards: keeping pace, correct usage
- Eye contact/gestures
- Involving audience by using individual personality according to topic.

Three winners will be chosen from our school level final to be held on **Tuesday 16th August at 9:00am**. These children will then represent St Angela's at a Cluster Final on **Monday 29th August at 9:30am at St Michael's, Baulkham Hills.** One winner from the cluster will progress to the Semi Final and perhaps the Grand Final following later in the term. Please also note it is never appropriate to approach other school children for clarification of an issue or event etc. Matters are always best handled by the teachers and school. Additionally, contacting other parents who you do not know well to discuss children's friendships etc is not always beneficial.

## **Values Matter at St Angela's**

During this term, starting this week, information on the "Nine Values for Australian Schooling" will be presented each week in our school newsletter. As you are aware the teaching of "Values Education" has been mandated by the Australian Government. These core values have been identified as including a range of secular and religious world views, and are common to most cultures. They underpin Australian society.

As a Catholic School we teach according to Jesus Christ's gospel values which strongly reflect the values of LOVE, FAITH, HOPE, RECONCILIATION, KINDNESS, SELF CONTROL, GENTLENESS, INTEGRITY, RESPECT and JUSTICE. Below is a summary of the nine values for Australian schooling.

#### Nine Values for Australian Schooling

- 1. Care and Compassion Care for self and others
- 2. <u>Doing Your Best</u> Seek to accomplish something worthy and admirable, try hard, pursue excellence
- 3. <u>Fair Go</u> Pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly for a just society
- 4. <u>Freedom</u> Enjoy all the rights and privileges of Australian citizenship free from unnecessary interference or control, and stand up for the rights of others
- 5. <u>Honesty and Trustworthiness</u> Be honest, sincere and seek the truth
- 6. <u>Integrity</u> Act in accordance with principles of moral and ethical conduct, ensure consistency between words and deeds
- 7. <u>Respect</u> Treat others with consideration and regard, respect another person's point of view
- 8. <u>Responsibility</u> Be accountable for one's own actions, resolve differences in constructive, non-violent and peaceful ways, contribute to society and to civic life, take care of the environment
- 9. <u>Understanding, Tolerance and Inclusion</u> Be aware of others and their cultures, accept diversity within a democratic society, being included and including others.
- A key aspect of this ongoing values education is the importance of students developing responsibility, resilience and social skills through co-curricular as well as curriculum programs.
