Sunday August 21st 2016 Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time-Year C

Luke 13:22-30 It is difficult to enter the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.' With these final words in this week's Gospel reading Jesus reminds us that societal status means nothing compared to one's status in God's kingdom. The acceptance of Jesus' message, along with faith and compassion, is what will make people first in God's kingdom. We are called to be Christ-like in our actions, taking Jesus as our role model of Christian life and following His examples. We can't be like Jesus all of the time, but we can certainly do our best to live as He has asked us. This week's gospel makes it clear that to gain salvation, we can't just 'turn up at the last minute' and expect to be received. Entrance into the kingdom of God belongs to those who accept and act upon the message of Jesus for the rest of their lives.
