Sunday, 2 Apr 2017: Fifth Sunday of Lent -Year A

Gospel Jn 11:1-45

Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead.

Sunday's Gospel tells us that Our Lord was moved with compassion in an almost violent way, raging at the seeming finality of death. The raising of Lazarus was a demonstration of his power to rob death of its supposed supremacy.

We can see that God does not leave us to languish in our various deaths. Instead, God offers us new life out of the tombs. All of this is accomplished through the mercy and compassion of God.

'I am the resurrection and the life.

If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.

Do you believe this?'

Q. In what ways can the story of Lazarus be applied to the need for reconciliation with self and others?

Q. What aspects of your life do you need to 'die' to or let go of to enter into a fuller, richer life?


