## **Religious Education**

Sunday, 9 Apr 2017: Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord - Year A

Gospel Mt 26:14 – 27:66 The Passion

As we prepare to enter the sacred time of Holy Week, we look again at the significance of Christ in our lives. Our saviour was nailed to a cross as a convicted felon, and there endured the sense of abandonment. Our saviour was lifted up and exalted precisely because he emptied himself of his divine privileges. Unlike conquerors who triumph by putting down their opponents, Jesus was raised up because he himself was first willing to be put down. We have a saviour who first offered himself for us and then continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow.

The best way to enter Holy Week with Jesus is in the company of those with whom he has identified himself: the poor and the broken; the humiliated and the marginalised; those who suffer the abuse of others; those who never use rank to force their will. If we are to be saved, we must go where salvation takes place: in our streets and in our homes where violence rages; in the dark corners of life where despair holds sway; wherever the innocent are abused or the needy are neglected; wherever there is misunderstanding or fear or jealousy. We must go wherever Christ empties himself for our sake.

Q. How does the story of Christ's Passion play out in our own lives today?

O Lord,

Risen, alive and full of grace.

You paid such a price that we may live in freedom today. We worship your holy name and give thanks for your redeeming grace.

Heavenly Father,

May we drink in your tender love so that we can pour this love out to others.

Come reign in our hearts, minds and spirits.

Holy Spirit,

We welcome you to blow through our every word, action and thought.

Come transform us on the inside so that each day we become more like our risen Lord.

Amen.
