Religious Education

Sunday, 19 Aug 2018: Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time -Year B Gospel Jn 6:51-58J

Whoever eats and drinks of the body and blood of Christ has eternal life.

This gospel passage continues the 'Bread of Life' discourse that we have been following through the Gospel of John for a few weeks now. It overlaps with the reading from last week with Jesus announcing that his flesh is the 'bread of life'. Not surprisingly, the Jewish audience is horrified by the idea of eating human flesh. Jesus drives his point home further with his audience by also referring to the drinking of blood. In Jewish tradition, even to touch blood made a person ritually unclean. Any meat that was to be eaten had to be drained of blood, according to kosher rules. The words used by Jesus in this passage are so confronting that they cannot possibly be taken literally. It is a complete overstatement of the image to try to make sure that a literal interpretation is impossible.

When the gospel writer has Jesus speaking about eating his flesh and drinking his blood he is drawing on a very old image of eating and drinking as representing 'absorbing'; or 'comprehending'; or 'understanding' the message of the speaker. In this ancient understanding, to 'eat the flesh' of Jesus is to take into yourself and accept everything that Jesus stands for; everything that Jesus teaches; everything that Jesus believes. It is an act of faith. When we received Christ in the Eucharist, is this the depth of significance and purpose with which we take communion? Unmistakably, this passage points us to the Christian sacrament of Eucharist. The practice of sharing Eucharist as a memorial of Jesus was already well established in the Christian communities by the time this gospel was written and throughout this extended discourse on the 'Bread of Life' the author provides a direct link between the practice of Eucharist and the teachings of Jesus.

Q. Why do you think this gospel text is critical to Catholic theology about Eucharist?

Q. In what ways is 'bread' an appropriate image for Jesus?

On Wednesday Grades 3-6 from OLOR travelled to St Angela's to celebrate mass with us at 11am under the big top. This was a wonderful opportunity to pray together and celebrate the feast of Mary's Assumption into heaven. Mary, our Mother, shares in the glory of God in heaven. Mary shows us that believing in God is a matter of complete faith and complete trust in God. We too are called to be faithful and trusting like Mary.

This coming week in Peer Support children will revise what they have learned about resilience and discuss the people who show them support. Through a story the children identify where the character has used her personal qualities, strengths and skills to help her overcome challenges. They identify times when she needed support to continue. The children discuss a range of challenges and determine the best person to approach for support. The children consolidate the protective factors for resilience by revising their own strengths and skills and identifying 5 people they can go to for support. Parents are asked to remind their child of their qualities and skills and encourage them to ask for help in challenging situations.

DIOCESAN VOICE OF YOUTH

As communicated, this term the students from Year 6 will be competing in the Parramatta Diocese Voice of Youth Competition. Our children are all busy writing and practising their speeches to present to their classes. The students have been given a list of criteria for judging. Some of these include:

Timing: 3-4 minutes

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- Stance: poised, comfortable, confident
- Topic Interest: Audience attention, appropriate level
- Voice: clarity, variety, loudness, pitch
 - Speech Cards: keeping pace, correct usage
- Eye contact/gestures
- Involving audience by using individual personality according to topic.

All students have presented their speeches in class and three from each class have been selected according to the above criteria to participate in our school final. Three winners will then be chosen from our school level final to be held this **Tuesday 21st August at 9:00am**. These children will then represent St Angela's at a Cluster Final on **Thursday 30th August 11:00am hosted here at St Angela's.** One winner from the cluster will progress to the Semi Final and perhaps the Grand Final following later in the term. This diocesan speech contest is being conducted so that children with a flair for public speaking have an opportunity to use this talent. Parents are most welcome to come along and support our students on either of these days as audience involvement is a major part of their speaking process.
