- Ò Save for retirement starting with your first pay cheque.
- \diamond When it comes to chocolate, resistance is futile.
- \Diamond Make peace with your past so it won't spoil the present.

It's OK to let your children see you cry. Don't compare your life to others. You have no idea what their journey is all about. Everything can change in the blink of an eye. But don't worry; God never blinks. Take a deep breath. It calms the mind. Get rid of anything that isn't useful, beautiful or joyful. Whatever doesn't kill you really does make you stronger. It's never too late to have a happy childhood. But the second one is up to you and no one else. When it comes to going after what you love in life, don't take no for an answer. Over prepare, and then go with the flow. Be eccentric now. Don't wait for old age to wear purple. No one is in charge of your happiness but you. NSWPSSA ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Well I'm excited! Last Wednesday and Thursday Keira Murphy (6 Blue) and Oshi Kirkley (6 Blue) competed at the NSWPSSA Athletics Championships. Keira and Oshi were competing against all primary school age children in the whole of NSW. It is such an achievement just to make it this far.

Keira competed in the 200m and 800m. For most children competing at these championships, athletics is their main sport and here we have Keira who dances, plays netball, basketball, swims and of course loves to run. Keira finished 15th in the 200m but it was her 800m that was so impressive. Keira took 21secs off the time she ran at our school carnival in August making the final and finishing 8th in the State for the 12 year girls 800m. Congratulations!

Winner!!! First place in the state. Oshi, where do we start! Oshi's relaxed approach to the whole championships was so refreshing. Oshi was competing in the 200m and 100m. Here you have a boy who doesn't even do Little Athletics and has had a few coaching sessions competing at a State level. Oshi qualified equal fastest in the 200m final pulled up a little sore from the Wednesdays events and finished a very creditable 4th in the final. With the semi finals and final of the 100m still to come he quickly learnt the importance of a warm up, cool down and hydration. Come race time it was a high 5 to each of his mates and a steely look of determination. To succeed at this level you have to have the perfect race and that's just what Oshi had, finishing 1st in the 12years Boys STATE 100m final, with an impressive time of 12.66 seconds. That's right 1st in the State Oshi Kirkley from St Angela's Castle Hill. Oshi will now go to Nationals in Victoria from the 24th November to 27th November. Oshi will be selling the official State Athletics raffle tickets at school on big top stage, starting tomorrow for the next few weeks, to help cover some of the expenses. Tickets are \$5.00 each with a great number of prizes including; Apple iPad, Fitbit Fitness Watch, Fitbit Activity Wristband and Sony Bluetooth Speakers
