Religious Education

Sunday, 25 Nov 2018: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - Year B Gospel Jn 18:33-37

Pilate questions Jesus about his identity.

This week marks the end of the liturgical year. Next week, with the first week of Advent, we begin the new liturgical cycle. It is fitting that the Church concludes the liturgical year with the celebration of Christ the King. The conversation between Jesus and Pilate displays a lot of word play on the part of Jesus and quite a lot of confusion on the part of Pilate. The confusion stems from different perceptions of what it means to be a king. For Pilate, part of the most powerful political and military rule in the ancient world, the idea of a king was a threat. Claiming kingship was claiming

authority and power that would inevitably lead to challenging the authority and power of Rome and, more directly, its representative in Palestine - Pilate. Jesus, of course, had a completely different idea about ushering in a kingdom. He does indeed declare that he is a king and that is what leads us to today's feast of Christ the King. However, his intention is not to claim a position of power and authority. When we think back to Jesus' teachings about the

kingdom of God, we recall that he declares the people of highest status - the first - in the kingdom to be the lowliest of this world. It is the poor, the sick, the outcast, the children and the widows who will hold the highest places in the kingdom of God. In a kingdom like that, what does it mean to declare oneself king? The confusion about what it means to be a king that is captured in this interaction between Jesus and Pilate is the same confusion that we saw among the disciples as they came to terms with exactly what it means to be the Messiah.

Q. How are we called to continue to bear witness to this truth?

Q. What does it mean for us that Jesus is 'king' of a kingdom filled with the sick, poor and outcast?

Advent Reconciliation

Next week Father Alejandro has invited the children from Years 2 -6 to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation as we prepare to enter the season of Advent. The children are called to recognise the importance of preparing for this new season and this can include asking for forgiveness for our sins to know that we are right with God. The sacrament "washes us clean," and renews us in Christ.

This week I received details of the purchases that were made with our donations for the children of Little Angels Care Home (Orphanage) in the Philippines. The money raised last term through our mufti day, purchased goods for the babies including cots, bottles, food, walkers.... Thank you for your support in meeting the needs of the most needy.

International Teachers' Day

This coming Thursday 29th November, we celebrate International Teachers' Day (official date earlier this term) here at St Angela's. Christ's blessings are clearly evident through our wonderful teachers. They are truly a gift to be celebrated.



Teachers will be treated to a delightful morning tea from the class parent reps. Appreciation and thanks to your Class Parent Representatives for their efforts in making the day so special for the staff.

Assessment Strategies

Teachers employ a variety of assessment strategies. One of the initial strategies is by Observation. Teachers are able to gauge the children's levels of understandings through observation of their practices and behaviours when undertaking a task. Checklists and anecdotal records help in the recording of these observations. Anecdotal records are a more informal form of assessment where the teacher takes observational notes on a student's achievements, beliefs, attitudes and skills as they are engaged in a task.

<u>Questioning</u> is another form of assessment and can be either written or oral. Higher order questions indicate not only facts retained by the student but also if the student is able to apply the known facts. Open ended questioning allows for more than one answer to a problem and involves thinking beyond facts or skills. Another assessment strategy widely used by teachers is <u>Testing</u>. Diagnostic tests assess specific concepts through written or oral questioning. They are used to diagnose areas of difficulty so that suitable teaching can take place. Performance based testing involves a practical test where the teacher assesses the student as they are involved in an activity. Pen and paper tests are used to assess skills and facts recently taught and are designed to assess a variety of outcomes. Multiple choice tests are generally included in more formal tests such as the NAPLAN test completed by the Years 3 and 5 students. Problem solving requires the student to reach a solution to a problem without the need to use a normal procedure or algorithm. Finally, teachers often ask the students to self reflect on their learning by recording their thoughts and experiences. This and other forms of self evaluation help the teacher to understand how a child feels about their learning and any difficulties they may be experiencing.
