We took the opportunity to say thank you and farewell to Fr Gerard at our liturgy. We have been blessed to have Fr Gerard as part of our community as a beloved Assistant Priest for the past 4 years. We will miss his generous, kind smile and warm, giving heart.

Lest We Forget 104 Years

The Anzac tradition was forged 104 years ago on 25 April 1915, when the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

It marked the start of a campaign which lasted eight months and resulted in some 26,000 Australian casualties, including 8,159 who were killed or died of wounds or disease. The bravery and spirit of those who served on the Gallipoli Peninsula shaped a legend, and so the 'Anzac' became a part of the Australian and New Zealand lexicon. In 1916, the first anniversary on the landing was observed in Australia, New Zealand, England and by troops in Egypt. That year, 25 April was named 'Anzac Day'. By the 1920's, Anzac Day ceremonies were held throughout Australia and the states had designated Anzac Day as a public holiday. Commemoration of Anzac Day continued throughout the 1930's and 1940's with World War II veterans joining parades around the country.

Over the ensuing decades, returned Australian servicemen and women from conflicts such as Malaysia, Vietnam, Korea, East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan as well as peacekeepers and veterans from allied countries, now march proudly in the parades.

> They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old; Age shall not wear them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

Thank you to our Year 6 teachers, Mrs Ogilvie, Mr Lee and Miss Fizely for coordinating Tuesday's reflective Anzac Day ceremony and to the Year 6 students who led us in prayer and reflection. The children respectfully and reverently participated in this significant ceremony with the parents and teachers. Thank you to all involved and those who attended. Special thanks to Colonel Don Tait for sharing stories of the Anzacs and his own experiences with us. We are grateful for his generous time and service to our country. During the ceremony, we remembered all those who died defending our country during the wars which Australia has been involved in this century. As has been tradition here at St Angela's after the service each child enjoyed an Anzac biscuit.

Religious Education

Sunday, 5 May 2019: Third Sunday of Easter - Year C Gospel

Jn 21:1-14

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish.

Gospel Reflection

Scholars suggest that the 21st chapter of the Gospel of John is a later addition to the gospel, especially given the finality of the language at the end of chapter 20. The style of chapter 21 is much more churchoriented than the earlier chapters. The barbecue breakfast on the beach takes on a Eucharistic feel and the passage is at pains to portray Peter as the leader of the disciples and the one chosen by Jesus to provide leadership into the future. We must remember that the Gospel of John was written almost 70 years after the death of Jesus and if this final chapter is indeed an addition then it is likely written some time in the 2nd century. It was only in the late 1st and early 2nd centuries that the church began to adopt a structure of bishops as leaders of communities and it was important to clearly establish the authority of Peter as the first leader of the Church and the authority of his successors. Obviously, a scriptural reference to Jesus' choice of Peter would have cemented the case and so this later addition to the Gospel of John may have been constructed to serve this purpose.

Regardless of its original intended purpose, this passage provides a wonderful account of the appearance of the resurrected Jesus to his disciples. Like other post-resurrection accounts, the disciples do not at first recognise Jesus and it is not until the miraculous catch of fish that the beloved disciple declares, 'It is the Lord'. In a beautifully everyday touch, the risen Jesus prepares breakfast on the beach for the disciples and blesses the simple food in the same way as he did the bread and wine at their last supper.

Q. Why do you think the disciples had gone back to fishing at this time?

Q. Why is it the amazing catch of fish that lets Peter recognise Jesus?

Welcome everyone to Term 2. This term begins with us continuing the Easter season which lasts for seven weeks and ends before Pentecost Sunday. Our students will continue on their faith and learning journey by revisiting the events that followed Jesus' resurrection.

National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy 2019 (NAPLAN)

In May 2019, the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in all government and nongovernment schools. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy learning of students in all Australian schools. The tests will be conducted at St Angela's, online from 14th to 16th May 2019.

Friday 17th May - A 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day.

Peer Support

Next week we will commence our Peer Support lessons. The whole school will participate in Peer Support for 30 minutes each week. During this time a Year 6, Peer Support Leader will facilitate a small group composed of 6 younger students, one from each grade, who work together through a number of structured activities. Each teacher will supervise 3-4 groups in their classroom. We will be working on a module called *Living Positively, to help us explore the concept of optimism. The module runs for 8 sessions. Our first session enables the children to get to know everyone in the group, agreeing on how they will work well together and interact cooperatively with others. They will also begin to think about what it means to be optimistic. We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week, as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session.*
