Sunday, 15 Sep 2019: Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year Cl

<u>Lk 15:1-32</u>

Scriptural context - Parables of the lost

The three parables that appear in Luke chapter 15 are unique to the gospel of Luke – none of the other gospels use these parables. They are used by the gospel writer to further highlight a theme that runs throughout this gospel: the release and acceptance of those who are oppressed and afflicted. It stems from the declaration of Jesus' mission in Chapter 4 when he reads from the scroll of Isaiah. More than any other gospel, this one portrays Jesus as having a special care and compassion for those who have been rejected by society.

Parable Of The Lost Coin

Bible Event – Jesus' Life

Have you lost anything of great monetary or sentimental value recently? How did you react? Perhaps, you shrugged your shoulders and drifted off to do something else! That's very unlikely, a sense of loss usually preoccupies us until we find our treasured article.

Jesus asked, "What woman, if she has ten silver coins and loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search thoroughly until she finds it?"

Jesus placed sinners at the top of His list of "Greatest Treasures" and He offered his own life to find their lost souls.

Jesus happily dined with sinners. He came into this world to share with them another way of life. He wanted them to repent and follow his teachings. In return, he forgave them their sins while the Angels in Heaven watched and rejoiced at the saving of each.

There is no greater loss than the loss of one's own soul.

Returning Notes and Permission Slips

For those families who are new to the school or those who may be unaware of our procedures, please note: Each morning teachers will ask the children in their class if they have any notes or money, then teachers will keep any information they require and will send any other notes or money to the office via the class note bag. We ask that when sending money, please ensure that envelopes are sealed and taped at either end so that money does not fall out. This system allows the office to receive notes and money without parents being required to actually come in to the school. It also helps the children develop responsibility for passing on information.
