A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

He is not a God of the dead but of the living.

We are urged to pray that the message of Jesus makes progress. This phrase, 'makes progress', is translated into many different ways in different Bibles. The New Jerusalem Bible says 'spread quickly'. The Good News Bible and the New Revised Standard Version say 'spread rapidly'. The Carmelite translation says 'speed on and triumph'. National Prayer Campaign for Drought

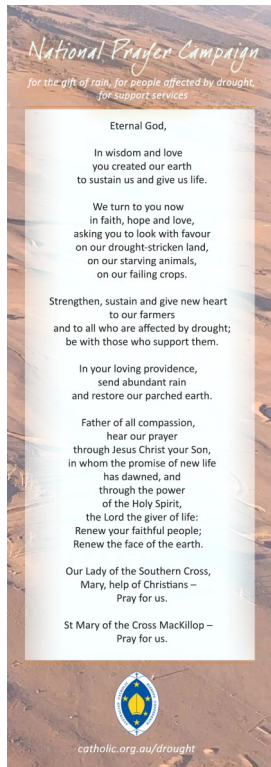
The Catholic Church in Australia is dedicating the month of November 2019 as a time to pray for those affected by crippling drought conditions and to pray for the gift of rain.
