

One of the greatest gifts that we can give our children is the love of reading. The quotes below attest to this.









Research tells us that

- few children learn to love books by themselves. Someone has to lure them into the wonderful world of the written word; someone has to show them the way.
- parents' engagement in their child's reading has a very positive impact on children's reading ability.
- young people who enjoy reading are three times as likely to read above the level expected for their age as young people who do not enjoy reading at all
- there is a clear relationship between receiving books as presents and reading ability. In fact, of the children that had received the gift of a book, 54.3% read above the expected level.

This week at St Angela's we have celebrated Book Week and have had many guest readers share their love of reading with the students. Each day the students have been treated to picture books being read by members of staff. Teachers have been spoiled with so many Bookface entries being sent into school by parents and children and everyone will enjoy a wonderful finale tomorrow with our St Angela's Book Character Parade. Thank you to Mrs Yager and Mrs North who planned so many creative experiences for the students and staff. Thank you to our fabulous teachers who have shared their passion for reading with their children.

Jesus is asked to name the greatest commandment of the Law.

Living the Gospel - Compassion

Jesus' words call us to love our neighbour as ourselves. We are called to treat others as we would like to be treated ourselves. To be able to do this, we need to picture ourselves in their place - experiencing all that they are experiencing; not imposing our own values and circumstances. To see ourselves in the place of another is the key to responding with compassion. The origin of the word 'compassion' means experiencing with. If we are able to truly 'experience with' another person perhaps then we can genuinely recognise and respond to their needs.

Gospel Focus – Love your neighbour as yourself

There is an implicit, or understood, commandment within the command to love your neighbour as yourself. That is, we must first love ourselves. Whilst to say someone 'loves themself' is used as a criticism of a person who is a bit too vain, that is not what is intended here. If we are to love others as we love ourselves we must first be content and happy with who we are. It is only when we are comfortable with who we are that we are able to reach out to those around us with compassion.

School Travel - Term 4 2020



Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a

result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.
