## 6 Gospel

JUN <u>Mk 14:12-16, 22-26</u>

2021 Jesus took bread, broke it and shared it.

#### **Historical Context – Covenant**

Covenant is a recurring element throughout the Old Testament writings. A covenant is a formal agreement between two or more parties. In the Biblical context, covenants were made between God and God's people. The first covenant, although not described as such, is the covenant between God and Adam – each promising certain things. After the failure of this covenant, God renewed the covenant promise to Noah and symbolised it with the rainbow. Later covenants were again struck with Abraham, Moses and David – each time initiated by God to give the people another chance to be faithful to their relationship.

#### Gospel Focus – Words of Institution

The words of the gospel passage in which Jesus takes bread and wine and blesses them will be familiar. They are the words used at the consecration of the bread and wine during the Mass. The words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper are regarded as instituting the celebration of the Eucharist. Jesus took an act that was familiar to the Passover meal and gave it a new meaning and a new significance for his followers. What had been a memory of escape from slavery in Egypt became an ongoing reminder of Christ's continued presence in the Eucharist and in the Eucharistic community.

On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May, Year 4 went to Cockatoo Island to learn about the convicts from Great Britain and their history. Year 4 went on a bus and a ferry. The ferry ride was very fun! The island was surprisingly small, but the views were beautiful at Cockatoo Island. There were places where we were so high above the ground! We all got to go around the whole of Cockatoo Island, go through the prisons and also old ruins of the buildings. One thing we learnt about the convicts was that they had to make their own prison, carving solid sandstone into bricks and putting marks on them so that people knew how many bricks they had carved and who carved it. We also got to visit the guard rooms, where the guards slept and monitored the convicts, and the small chapel where the convicts went to pray. We all learnt so much!

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#### Peer Support Session 7 - Standing Together

This session looked at the impact of how working together as a team with similar beliefs, can provide a barrier to bullying. When everyone is focussed on promoting positive behaviours that respect diversity and individual need, bullying can be reduced. The activities focused on building the strength of teams and awareness of the responsibilities of bystanders to assist in a whole of school approach.

Schools continue to be on alert for the signs of COVID. Please see the NSW Health Guidelines below for students returning to school after an illness( NB these guidelines have not changed):

- Students must not attend school if they are unwell. This includes even minor flu symptoms
- Should a student be absent due to a sore throat or flu like symptoms they must return a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom free before returning to school
- Schools must sight the negative COVID -19 test prior to allowing students to return to school
- If you do not wish your child to undertake a COVID -19 test or provide the school with a negative test result, the guidelines are that the student is to be excluded from school for a 10-day period. Additionally the student must be symptom free for at least 3 days before returning to school
- If your child has complex health please have your child assessed by your medical practitioner. Where a medical practitioner determines that a COVID-19 test is not
  required, a medical certificate must be provided to the school to confirm that the student does not have symptoms that warrant a COVID-19 test. The certificate must
  also indicate that the student is able to return to the school environment.

Thank you for your continued cooperation in ensuring the safety of all students and staff at St Angela's.

## **Children's Work Books Coming Home**

Over the next few weeks the children will be bringing home their exercise books to share with you. This week the children's Maths and Religious Education books are coming home. Please take the time to look through, discuss and enjoy the learning your child has undertaken. Please remember that not all learning undertaken in Key Learning Areas is recorded in workbooks. Keep an eye out next week for workbooks in the other key learning areas. We encourage you to write a comment to your child in their book after their last piece of work. Children really do treasure your comments and it allows us to see that the book did indeed leave the school bag and that you have taken the time to walk through it with your child. Additionally, we ask that the books be returned promptly the next school day so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.

## Premier's Reading Challenge Some Interesting PRC Statistics for 2021 so far.....


Some Interesting PRC Statistics for 2021 so far...... 143 students have completed the challenge so far and they have read 5229 books in total.
