Klds Messenger



It has come to our attention that a large number of students have access to Kids Messenger and are using it out of school to be in contact with their friends. Please be aware that if children are using this platform it is vital that parents are supervising their child's engagement with it. You are able to

set up a Parent Dashboard that allows you to have oversight of almost everything that your child is doing on Kids Messenger. However one area that you do not have control over or insight into is video chats. Your children can say or show anything they want to (and you won't be able to review it), unless you're around to keep an eye on things. They can also create group chats (which you don't need to approve). It does seem that many parents felt that during lockdown and remote learning Kids Messenger was a helpful tool to keep children connected to each other when they could not be connected at school. It would seem timely now that the children have returned to school, that you review your child's need to access this platform when the children are physically back at school and seeing their friends everyday. It is always good to remember that the advice from the e-safety commission is that young children under 13 years of age require careful parental setup and oversight whenever using social media platforms such as Kids Messenger -- and limited amounts of time spent using it. It is far more developmentally appropriate and healthy for young children to be communicating with their friends face to face through play and activity.

Hand sanitising on entry to the school

One of our key COVID safe strategies is that every child coming into the school in the mornings sanitises their hands. Please remind your child that this is an important procedure each and every morning and is part of our coming into school process at both the back and front gates and via cars and buses in the mornings.




Air Filters

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C -28th November 2021

Gospel Lk 21:25-28. 34-36 Be ready for the second coming.

Scriptural context

This week's gospel passage comes from a lengthy passage in the gospel of

Luke in which Jesus speaks extensively about the future. It is a very different style of writing from the usual narrative. teaching and parable forms that make up most of the gospel. The style is an echo of the prophetic writings of the Old Testament. Compare this passage with this week's first reading of other passages from the writings of the prophets. The style is always rich in metaphor and symbol. There is a grandness about the style. We know, just from the use of language, that great things are afoot!

Have you thought? – Waiting, waiting, waiting ...

I'm not a big fan of waiting! Anticipation is pretty good; getting prepared and getting ready are OK, too. But when is comes down to being all dressed up and ready to go, I'm just hopeless at waiting. If Advent is a time of pointless waiting for Christmas then we've somehow missed the message. Rather than just waiting, Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation. But it's not just about anticipating Christmas. That's part of it, sure. However, Advent is about reminding ourselves that we have a job to do: preparing for the reign of God - in our lives and in our world.

Some COVID Reminders

- Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any student with any COVID -19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurring symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.
- Wear a face mask. It's a condition of entry
- Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested immediately and self-isolate until a negative result is received. Locations of testing clinics are available here.
- At this stage we are not able to accept a RAPID ANTIGEN negative test result in place of a standard **COVID PCR test.**
- Please continue to monitor the NSW government COVID-19 News and updates webpage for locations where there may have been exposure to COVID-19 and adhere to the advice as appropriate.
