Family Connection

Agreat reminder in "Family Week"

In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying, "Listen to him." The Transfiguration was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. They most certainly left this focused moment with a new appreciation for the importance of Jesus' words even if they did not yet understand everything that he had taught them. During Lent, we are invited to consider our attentiveness to Jesus and to one another. In the pace and noise that often characterises family life, how well do we listen to one another? What opportunities do we have for quiet prayer?

As you gather as a family, count the number of pieces of equipment in your home that produce sound: televisions, radios, CD players, computers, video games, etc. Observe if sometimes more than one piece of equipment is playing simultaneously and how this might affect communication. Discuss the question: What is it like to try to talk with one another when this equipment is on? Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 9:28-36. Consider whether the noise and pace of your family life allows family members opportunities for quiet prayer. During Lent, it may be appropriate for your family to choose a time for quiet in the household by turning off televisions, radios, and CD players. Consider whether your family would like to establish such a time during this Season of Lent and suggest that it might allow you the opportunity to listen more attentively to one another and to find time for quiet prayer. Spend a few such moments as a family, asking God to help you listen well to one another and to Jesus.

Why did my child have another teacher at school today?

From time to time your child 's class may have a replacement teacher for the day. At St Angela's we have a highly professional and dedicated relief staff who know our school and our procedures very well. When your child's teacher is not at school to teach them we rely on these teachers to continue the learning programme for our students. Your child's teacher may be away for a number of reasons including:- various leave entitlements - sick, caring, bereavement, long service leave; attendance at professional learning courses and the implementation of ongoing student assessments.

What happens in a Numeracy Block at St Angela's?

'Numerate': To be numerate is to use mathematical ideas to make sense of the world.

Students at St Angela's follow the Parramatta Literacy and Numeracy strategy called Focus 160.

This means that every day, children will undertake 100 minutes of Literacy and 60 minutes of Numeracy.

Our Numeracy Block consists of three elements:

- 1. <u>WARM UP</u> (10-15 mins) Always number based: Counting, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction or Multiplication and Division. Targeted to point of need. 'Tuning in' and warming up. Teachers 'track' children's progress.
- 2. <u>RICH TASK</u> (30-40 mins) Learning Intention discussed and broken down. Success criteria co-constructed. Task differentiated for children.
- 3. $\underline{\text{REFLECTION}}$ (10-15 mins) Explicit teaching time. Explore questions raised by students.

At St Angela's, children are encouraged to have a 'Growth Mindset'. See below for some reflective comments from our students regarding a 'Growth Mindset':

- You don't need to be fast at Maths to be great.
- Your brain is growing and changing all the time.
- Mistakes help grow your brain and challenges are really good for you.
- Believing in yourself changes the way you learn.
- Everyone can learn Maths to a high level.
