Welcome back to Term 2! A particularly special welcome to our new student and his family Hayden Dias in KG.

I trust that all our students and families were able to enjoy the beautiful weather that we were blessed with throughout the holidays. Those two weeks provided us all with an opportunity to spend precious time with our families and enjoy a much needed slower pace.

We have commenced the term with a very busy first week back - our Year 3 students have already had an excursion to Brewongle; on Wednesday, Year 6 led our school ANZAC Prayer liturgy; today our Kinder children led the whole school in our Easter Resurrection Prayer celebration and tomorrow Year 4 attend their excursion to Cockatoo Island, Year 6 commence their Peer Support Leaders training and the school canteen will reopen..

Thank you to everyone for continuing to follow our COVID safe strategies:

- informing the school if your child has COVID and isolating at home,
- communicating with the school if your children are close household contacts (close contacts may attend school if they are symptom free and if they have a RAT each day)

- keeping children at home if they are unwell or have symptoms such as a cough, runny nose or headache

Over the first weeks of the term each child will receive a RAT Multipack to assist families if their child is displaying symptoms or while they are a close household contact.

On Monday 25th April our School Captains Jesselyn Tedja and Brendan Khoudair represented St Angela's at the Castle Hill RSL ANZAC Day Dawn Service. This was a beautiful ceremony and a wonderful tribute to those who have kept so many safe in times of War.

COVID SAFE PROTOCOLS

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Therefore we ask that students, staff and family members who visit the school

- stay home if unwell,
- get tested immediately for COVID-19 if you become symptomatic and isolate until you receive a negative result
- practice good hand hygiene by washing regularly with soap and water
- consider taking a RAT before attending large school gatherings and events

Parents are required to:

- inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.
- inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic

Talk with your child about what she reads. Discuss all kinds of things, such as characters, plot and word definitions. Link reading to her life. Does she relate to characters or situations? What would she have done if she were the character? Woolworths Junior Landcare Grants Program



In 2021, we were able to secure a Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant which helped us to implement an effective paper recycling program throughout the school.

We also developed a Recycling Club which students from Years 5 and 6 are able to join. The Recycling Club is responsible for assisting the school with paper recycling and helping with educating the younger students on the importance of recycling.

The Landcare Grant also allowed us to purchase a soft plastics recycling system through Plastics Police, which we will be implementing *this term. Students will be able to recycle their soft plastics rubbish such as snaplock bags, chip packets and Glad Wrap. Any items of rubbish with the Red Cycle symbol will be able to be recycled through our plastic recycling program. More information about this will be shared in our upcoming newletters.*

I would like to thank Mrs Arrastia for her support and guidance with the Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant, as well as our Recycling Club for their hard work and perseverance.
