PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As parents, one of the most helpful partnerships that we can have with the school is to know what our children are doing and learning at school during the day. PEER SUPPORT

Our whole school will be starting Peer Support sessions next week. The children will be participating in a new module, Moving Forward which focuses on resilience.

The experiences in the module help children to identify their qualities and strengths, develop skills, respond with a range of strategies and seek support when faced with challenges. In the first session, the children will establish connections with the other members of their group and develop their group agreement to enable them to work well together. The children will discuss an example of a challenging situation and some resilient and non resilient responses. You might like to discuss with your child what they can do to help them take an active role in Peer Support.

My child is learning to read, but it's hard for her. She doesn't want to pick up books at home. How can I help? Make books around the house as appealing as possible. Choose stories that include mostly familiar words. Look for subjects she loves or new topics she might embrace. Also consider books with short items

to read, such as jokes or rhymes. Books with appealing pictures are great, too!

Ask questions to get your child thinking and talking about reading

It is critical that your child read over the summer. Help her reflect on what she reads and improve her comprehension by asking a lot of

- questions! You might ask:
 Who were the main characters? What did you like or dislike about them? Do they remind you of people you know? How?
- What happened in the story? How did it start? What happened in the middle? How did it end? Were you happy with the way the book ended?
- Have you ever experienced
 comothing that happened
- something that happened to the characters in the story?What would you change about the book if you were the author? What plot would make a good sequel?

- No delivery to the school can be made for the use of vouchers. Please confirm how many vouchers you will be using and Elle will let you know when it is ready for pick up from Oz Fashions in Granville.

PLEASE NOTE: Oz Fashions in Granville does not stock your uniforms in store, it is only a pick up point after the email request has been sent.

COMMUNICATION WITH TEACHERS

St Angela's Primary recognises that email is a fast and convenient way to communicate with your child's teacher. As you would appreciate, teachers read their emails at various times throughout the school day. Further, that other than in the case of a genuine emergency, they are generally not expected to respond to emails from parents and students outside of normal working hours. Please keep in mind that if you send an email to a member of our staff outside of normal working hours, a reply may not be received until the following working day.

If you wish to contact your child's teacher, please continue to direct your emails to the school email account which will then be passed onto the relevant teacher, as per our usual practice.

GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

It would be most helpful if parents who need to make last minute <u>temporary</u> changes to going home arrangements, inform the school by 2:00pm via email <u>on the day</u> and not in advance. Thank you

BIRTHDAY TREATS

In 2023, students are able to bring birthday cupcakes, doughnuts or frozen Zooper Doopers to school to share with their class. If you do not wish your child to receive a cake, donut or Zooper Dooper, when it is brought in by another student for their birthday celebration please inform the teacher in writing.

The following guidelines taken from the St Angela's Parent Handbook apply to these treats: Some parents like to send a birthday treat to school to share. If you would like to do this, please send individual treats e.g. cupcakes, donuts or frozen Zooper Doopers as these are very manageable, (as opposed to a cake which is difficult to divide). As with all food brought to school, cakes should be nut free. If your child has allergies, you are encouraged to provide an alternate treat, in a labelled container, that can be left at school for them to have on other childrens' birthday celebrations.

Please Note: Due to allergies, we ask that you do not send lollies, chocolates or other treats such as icecream/iceblock variants.

WINTER UNIFORM

Students will have a change over uniform period and will move into their winter uniform by the commencement of Week 4. As the weather can be unpredictable and even remain quite warm at the beginning of Term 2, please feel free to send your child in either uniform until the commencement of Week 4. **Final uniform changeover date will be Monday May 15, 2023.**

WATCH OUT FOR CYBERBULLYING — online bullying can have a devastating impact on young people, whose online life is a key part of their identity and how they interact socially.

'SHARENT' RESPONSIBLY - not heard the term 'sharent'? Well, if you are a parent who shares then that's you! Be mindful about sharing your child's first day of school and other milestones on social media.

SET SCREEN TIME LIMITS - With screens increasingly being used at school and home, it's important to ensure your child has a healthy balance of offline and online time. Setting screen-free zones in the home and negotiating switch off times are useful ways to do this. Screens should never be taken into the bedroom or bathroom. Don't forget, quality over quantity! <u>See more information about managing screen time</u>.

USE TOOLS - parental controls on smartphones, TVs and computers can help limit your child seeing inappropriate content and help manage their time online. Make sure the privacy settings on their apps and games are turned on and help show them how to block and report people online. Helping your family stay safe online

Children can learn, explore, play and make friends online. But there can be risks. Your child might accidentally see upsetting content, be contacted by strangers or experience bullying. They might also miss out on important things like spending time outside.

Here are some easy things you can do to help keep children safe online.

Talk about online safety as a family

Let your child know they can always come to you if something happens online that makes them feel scared or upset.

You can ask your child to show you the games and apps they use. Use eSafety's <u>conversation</u> <u>starters</u> to help you get started.

Set up family rules together

As a family, you can choose some easy rules to help keep everyone safe online. You can include things like where devices can be used, what games and apps your children can use, and how much time can be spent online. Most devices and apps have features to set limits on how they are used. Watch <u>this video</u> to learn more about parental controls and settings.

Know where to get help

If you need help with an online issue and you are not sure what to do, talk about it with someone you trust, like a friend or a teacher at your child's school. You can also speak to someone at <u>Parentline</u> for help with parenting challenges. The eSafety Commissioner (eSafety) helps to keep all Australian families safe online.
