PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

A topic that frequently comes up in the media and in our conversations with parents is building resilience, Michael Grose explains that the research shows resilience can be nurtured and developed, particularly when parents themselves are resilient and they actively foster it in their kids. He suggests that parents can coach their kids through some of their more challenging moments and review what they may have learned for next time. As a parent it is hard to avoid solving all our children's problems for them but if we do we can help improve their resilience. Often our children surprise us because they may be more resilient than we are about circumstances. You can promote a lasting sense of resilience in your children by:

- 1. Having a positive attitude yourself. Your attitude as a parent impacts on your child's ability to bounce back from some of the difficulties they face. Make sure you model a 'you can do it' attitude for your child when they meet some of life's curve balls.
- 2. Look for teachable moments. Many children's learning opportunities are disguised as problems. Make the most of these opportunities so that children can grow and learn from some of the challenges they face.
- 3. Make children active participants in the family. Active participation in a family develops the self-help, problem-solving and independence skills of children that are necessary for resilience.

Promoting resilience in children is a not a single event but a continuous process that requires adults to be supportive and empathetic when things don't go their way. It also requires you as a parent to have an understanding of resilience, so that you can have faith in yourself, and your child's ability to cope.

STUDENT ILLNESS OR INJURY

If your child has been injured and requires assistance to move around the school, parents are asked to advise Mrs Nettleton, prior to them returning to school. Children who carry an injury and are required to wear a Post Surgery Boot, use crutches or operate a wheelchair must have their safety reviewed whilst onsite. It is important that we provide a safe and supportive environment whilst your child recovers.

Health Awareness

In our school community we have students and staff with compromised health. It is very important if your child has COVID, cold or flu like symptoms that you do not send them to school. In addition please report to the school if your child is sick with RSV, chicken pox or measles as these are highly contagious illnesses. Thank you for all that you are doing to keep our students and staff safe.

Families at St Angela's continue to experience COVID cases, so it is important for you to monitor your children for symptoms and keep them at home if they are unwell.

We will also contact you if your child feels unwell at school. As it is flu season, please be vigilant about the early signs of influenza which also require you to keep your children at home to ensure that we continue to maintain a healthy environment for the children and staff while at school.

COVID SAFE PROTOCOLS

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Therefore we ask that students, staff and family members who visit the school to Inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home until they are symptom free and well again.

- School playground equipment returned ready to be played with.




ADDITIONAL PLAYGROUND AREA


An Evening of Sacred Music
