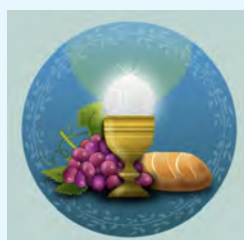

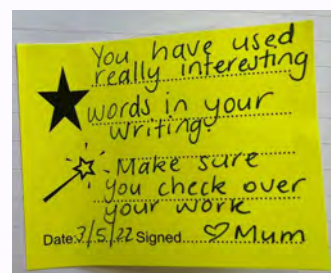
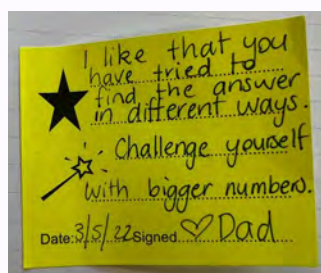

## Children's Work Books Coming Home

Tomorrow, the children will be bringing home their Maths and Religion books for you to look through with them. They will have selected a page that they are proud of and would like to share with you. This page will have a yellow post-it note attached to it.

The students are familiar with the feedback model used on this post-it note "Stars and Wishes". In this model, the student is provided with a "star" which is something that they have done well, and a "wish" which is a goal for them to work towards.

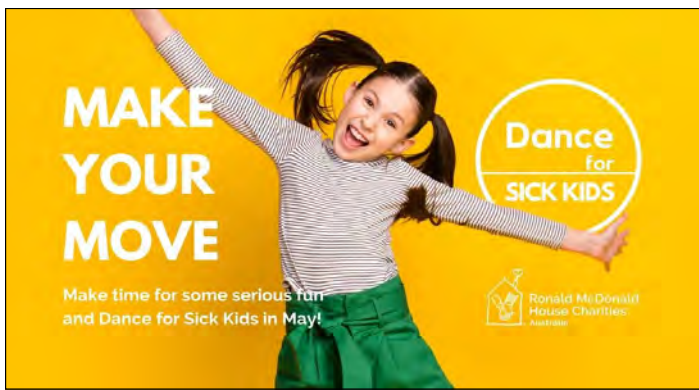

## PEER SUPPORT

This week we commenced our Peer Support lessons. The whole school participates in Peer Support for 30 minutes each week. During this time a Year 6, Peer Support Leader facilitates a small group composed of 6 younger students, one from each grade, who work together through a number of structured activities. Each teacher will supervise 3-4 groups in their classroom. We are working on a module called *Living Positively*, to help us explore the concept of optimism. The module runs for 8 sessions.

Our first session this week enabled the children to get to know everyone in the group, agreeing on how they will work well together and interact cooperatively with others. They also began to think about what it means to be optimistic.

Next week, in Peer Support the children will share the things they enjoy in life and have an opportunity to discuss their favourite activity. This session enables children to recognise what makes them happy. We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week, as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session.

## Year 5 Sydney Zoo

On the 6th of May, Year 5 went to the Sydney Zoo to learn more about our Science topic "Environmental changes forcing plant and animal adaptations in order to survive". We had so much fun and wanted to share it with you.

On arrival we were greeted by the very noisy gorillas, who welcomed us with loud clapping on our way to the Harvey Norman pavilion where we had our recess.

Our guide was a Zoologist named Louis. He taught us so much about animal adaptations. He also brought out a snake and a Shingleback for us to pat. Did you know that shinglebacks can walk backwards so that when their prey comes towards them they will bite their tail thinking it was their head? Then, the shingleback snaps around and bites the animal's head!

We split into groups to walk around the zoo. We started at the Aquarium where we discovered that a bull shark has 8 fins to propel itself and to stay balanced. We also learnt that Crocodiles have super large lungs so that they can spend long amounts of time underwater. We then made our way to the reptiles, followed by the nocturnals. Here we learned that bats have bad eyesight and live in the dark so they use echolocation to find their way. We went through the Australian Native section where we saw kangaroos and learned that koalas sleep 18 hours a day because eucalyptus leaves give them little energy. Next stop was the South East Asian section with the big apes and red pandas. After lunch we visited the African section before heading back to school.

Thanks to the year 5 teachers and parent helpers for this wonderful learning opportunity.

We will provide more information about access to the survey in following newsletters and Compass messaging.

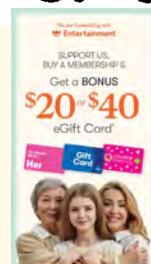

Thank you for your ongoing support of the safety of our student, families and neighbours.

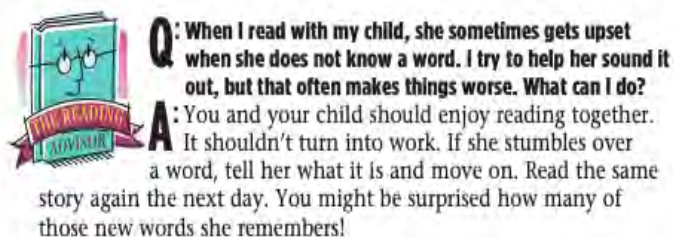

## Avoid discouraging your reader

It is important not to unknowingly discourage your child from reading, especially if she's reluctant to read. In order to motivate your child to read:

- **Don't nag.** Lecturing your child is unlikely to help.
- **Don't bribe.** It's good to reward effort, but your child shouldn't expect a prize every time she reads.
- **Don't judge how well** your child reads. Offer help when she needs it, but remember that reading should be fun.
- **Don't criticize your child's reading choices.** Reading just about anything is better than not reading at all.
