St Angela's School Community invites all grandparents to join us for a celebration of joy and thanksgiving to honour the gift of grandparents to our children. We hope that this day will continue to strengthen the bonds grandparents have with their grandchildren and nurture the unique tradition that we share in each family.

Program outline:

- 8:45am Morning assembly/Prayer of thanksgiving for our grandparents
- Classroom visits to join in learning activities with the children
- Morning tea in the St Maximilian school hall

This is a wonderful event and is a highlight of our calendar for all grandparents who enjoy visiting the school.

As a large number of visitors are anticipated we ask that you bring in a plate to share for morning tea if you have a grandparent attending. Your contribution can be left in the hall on Thursday afternoon, 27th October or the morning of Friday 28th October.

Morning tea/catering arrangements: The morning tea will be in the hall and we kindly ask families to assist with the catering. It would be appreciated if goodies are provided on disposable plates and ready to serve (nut free please). To ensure a balance of food items -

- ▲ all yellow classes (K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6) are kindly asked to bring cakes, scones or pikelets;
- ▲ all blue classes (K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6) are kindly asked to bring slices or biscuits;
- all green classes (K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6) are kindly asked to bring sandwiches, savouries, dips or cheese & biscuits.

Families with more than one child at school are only required to provide one plate of whichever category they would like to choose. Although we have lots of seating, any additional fold up chairs etc. would be beneficial as we are certainly expecting a large number of visitors. If you are able to assist in setting up, serving or packing up, please contact the office or volunteer on the day.

Parking

To assist with our elderly visitors, the Kiss and Drop may also be used for grandparents to be dropped off. Additionally <u>all</u> car parking at the front of the school and around the hall will be made available for elderly who have restricted mobility etc. (ie. disabled parking).





Religious Education

Sunday 23rd October 2016: Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C Luke 18:9-14

Those who humble themselves will be exalted.

This parable begins 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray'. But the tax collector is the only one who actually prayed: 'God be merciful to me, a sinner'. The other, who was a Pharisee informs God of how well he is doing in the piety stakes.

The other is said to be 'humble'. He is well-grounded and knows where he is standing with God. It takes courage and humility to admit to God exactly where we stand.

Diocesan Mission Mass and Mission at St Angela's

On Friday the 14th of October, we went to St Patrick's Cathedral in Parramatta, with Mr Calabria and Mrs Yager for a special Diocesan Catholic Mission Mass. We learnt a lot about Catholic Mission and its works during our time at the Cathedral. In the poorest parts of Cambodia, Sister Eulie Desacula from the Daughters of Charity, goes out to the children from disadvantaged communities and gives them an education they would otherwise never receive. Tuk-tuks are small carts towed on the back of a motorcycle which have been transformed. The inside of the tuk-tuk is a portable classroom for the children whose parents cannot afford a proper education. The Mission Mass was a wonderful opportunity to share our faith and our catholic mission with our peers in the Diocese.

Year 3 and 4 Surf Safe Incursion

On Tuesday, 18th of October, Year 3 and 4 participated in an incursion about surf safety, presented by the Surf Life Saving Association. There were three stations, run by 5 wonderful life savers, where we learnt about CPR, sun and surf safety and first aid. In first aid, we learnt what to do if we get a bad injury. It was really cool seeing all the medical badges, epipens etc. In surf and sun safety we learnt how to prevent getting skin cancer, such as wearing sunglasses, a brimmed hat and a rash shirt. When wearing sunscreen, we discovered that the higher the number the better the protection from the sun's UV rays. CPR was the coolest. All Year 3 and 4 got to experience CPR on an adult dummy and a baby one. As we performed the compressions, we sang "Row, row, row your boat" to keep us in the correct rhythm and if we sang it twice it would give us the 30 compressions needed.

Our incursion was so much fun and we learnt lots of important things that we need to know to keep us safe.
