

Religious Education

Sunday 20th November 2016: Our Lord Jesus Chríst, Kíng of the Uníverse - Year C

Gospel Luke 23:35-43 The Crucifixion

In Sunday's Gospel, amidst all the scoffing and jeering and the taunting of Our Lord, one of the criminals crucified with Jesus simply pleads:

'Jesus, remember me, when you come into your kingdom.' This poor tortured criminal recognised in his fellow crucified, someone who embodied the power of God to save him – to save him from the realm of everlasting death and to transfer him to the divine realm of everlasting life. Unlike the jeering and taunting leaders, he saw the truth of the inscription: 'Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews.' He does not plead for mercy in so many words. He simply pleads: 'Remember me'. It was enough for him if this Jesus would 'bring him to mind', would 'know him by heart'.

Which word or phrase from the gospel most catches your attention? Why?

What can we learn from the interaction between Jesus and the second criminal?

Year of Mercy Concludes: This Sunday 20th of November, on the Solemnity of Christ The King, the Extraordinary Year of Mercy will

come to an end. The Holy Doors at three basilicas in Rome – St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. John Lateran and St. Mary Major - were closed during special Masses held Nov. 13. The Holy Doors at churches and basilicas around the world also closed on the same day including The Holy Doors at St Patrick's Cathedral in Parramatta which were closed by Bishop Vincent.





On Sunday, Pope Francis will close the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica. It is estimated that over 20 million people attended Year of Mercy events at the Vatican over the course of this year. I was fortunate enough to be one of those people who walked through the Holy Doors at St Peter's Basilica and received God's forgiveness and Mercy.

May the graces we have received in this Year Of Mercy live on in our families, community and in our world.

2017 News for Home Learning

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As you are aware, St Angela's children currently use Mathletics and Reading Eggs. The cost of subscribing to Mathletics and Reading Eggs has been significantly increased by the 3P organisation for 2017. After research into other contemporary online learning resources, we will begin 2017 with your child's class using a free version of Studyladder, an online educational program which allows students to learn at their own pace. Studyladder is a web based educational program designed by teachers for teachers and students. The program is curriculum based and covers Mathematics, Literacy and a range of other subjects. Classroom teachers will set tasks for your child to complete. As a parent, you can join Studyladder for free, link your account to your child's account and monitor their progress. Visit www.studyladder.com.au for more details. We will no longer be using Mathletics in 2017. Keep an eye out for more information regarding this new online learning support tool which will pass on significant cost savings to parents.
