## 2017 News for Home Learning (As communicated earlier)

As you are aware, St Angela's children currently use Mathletics and Reading Eggs. The cost of subscribing to Mathletics and Reading Eggs has been significantly increased by the 3P organisation for 2017. After research into other contemporary online learning resources, we will begin 2017 with your child's class using a free version of Studyladder, an online educational program which allows students to learn at their own pace. Studyladder is a web based educational program designed by teachers for teachers and students. The program is curriculum based and covers Mathematics, Literacy and a range of other subjects. Classroom teachers will set tasks for your child to complete. As a parent, you can join Studyladder for free, link your account to your child's account and monitor their progress. Visit [www.studyladder.com.au](http://www.studyladder.com.au) for more details. We will no longer be using Mathletics in 2017. Keep an eye out early next year for more information regarding this new online learning support tool which will pass on significant cost savings to parents.

## Applying for School Opal Card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school, using bus, train and ferry services you nominate in your application.

### Who can apply:

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

- ◆ Children in Kindergarten to Year 2 (there is no minimum distance)
- ◆ Children in Years 3-6 - you would need to reside 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking distance from school.

### Who needs to apply:

**Most students will not need to apply for the School Opal card if they currently hold a 2016 School Travel Pass. The School Opal card will be sent to school automatically at the beginning of the new school year in 2017.** An application is needed if the student:

- ◆ Has not had a travel pass before
- ◆ Is moving from Year 2 to Year 3
- ◆ Is changing schools
- ◆ Is changing address

### How to apply:

1. Complete the application at [transportnsw.info/school-students](http://transportnsw.info/school-students). School will then receive notification of your application and will now endorse all applications online. **Please note there is no longer any need to print and send the application to the school office for endorsement.**

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school.
