## **Religious Education**

Sunday, 26th Mar 2017: Fourth Sunday of Lent - Year A

Jn 9:1-41 Jesus cures a man who was blind from birth on the Sabbath. In Sunday's Gospel, a man born blind has his sight restored by Jesus simply enough, his journey from darkness into light is a more complicated affair. He faces disbelief, ridicule and even abuse from the Jewish authorities as they try to discredit Jesus and diminish the impact of the miracle. In fact, their treatment of the man is what drives him along the road from recipient of an act of mercy to a confirmed believer. Furthermore, the Jewish authorities, despite their physical capacity for sight, are shown to be the ones who are truly blind and trapped in darkness because they deny the light that is before their very eyes.

Sunday's Gospel is the main scripture explored by grades 4 – 6 in their Lenten units. They have used the Three Senses of exploring scripture to gain a deeper level of understanding and connection to the story. The following are some Year 5 student responses

In the Gospel story Jesus Heals the Man born Blind, blindness has two meaning: One is literal blindness, and then there is spiritual blindness. Literal blindness was that the man could not see in the story. Spiritual blindness were those that just walked past him.

In our time blindness could represent two things again: Literal blindness can be treated by doctors, spiritual blindness is pretending we don't see those who are in need.

In my life blindness is being spiritually blind by not helping those that I see are in need.

#### **University of NSW Initiative**

International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) provide an opportunity for all students to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external assessment situation.

This year, children are again invited to participate in the ICAS English and Mathematics competitions. Dates and the cost of each assessment are listed below. Due to a low number of students participating in other exams in previous years, these two papers are the only ones that will be offered in 2017 (as per 2016).

Both these papers will be sat at 7:30am, so as to not impact upon class learning time. Participation is optional. The test must be done on the designated day at the designated time. Unfortunately, tests not completed during the supervised time cannot be done at an alternative time.

#### **Sports Houses**

#### **Merici**

The family name of St Angela.

#### Garda

A large beautiful lake in the north of Italy which Angela visited very often.

#### Salo

A town on the shores of Lake Garda. Angela lived in this town as a young girl with her aunt and uncle after her parents died.

#### Brescia

A big city in the north of Italy. Angela lived and worked here. It was here that her thoughts and ideas were put into writing and she began the order of the Ursuline Sisters in 1535.

The children stay in the same sports house whilst at St Angela's. Siblings are in the same house. In this way we hope the children will develop a loyalty to their special house.

#### **Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) Survey**

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will be once again participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) survey. The QCS survey provides information from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community, and assists us in our focus on continuous improvement.

Between now and 31st March 2017 all staff, Years 3 - 6 students and 60 randomly-selected parents by the survey organisers will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20 minutes to complete.

This year we will again be able to gain even more information about the link between student wellbeing and learning outcomes. To do this we will need to include a student identifier in the student survey. The survey will still remain confidential and individual survey responses will not be accessible by the school or the Catholic Education Office. An independent survey consultant (Insight SRC) who manages the data collection will ensure the survey data is kept strictly confidential. Each school will receive a de-identified information report at the end of May to help them to develop strategies for further improvement. This will definitely assist the school in working with all students to further improve their learning.

As a parent if you are randomly-selected to complete the survey, you are encouraged to participate as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.
