Gospel

Matthew 13:44-52

Jesus describes the kingdom through images. Two themes seem to weave through the readings for this Sunday: treasure and delight. The treasure is the extraordinary gift that comes from God; the delight is the joy that we experience when we realise that the treasure is ours.

The treasure is the kingdom of heaven. It is the prize that gives meaning to the present, and its fullest delight draws us into the future. The reign of God is the fulfilment of our deepest desires and our fondest hopes. Nothing in the world can compare with it, and that is why we are willing to sacrifice everything to attain it. The treasure that we find is really a gift that is given. We need not work to attain the kingdom, nor can we earn it in any way. It is given to us by God. All we have to do is accept it.

Over the coming weekends, as a school and parish community we celebrate and share the joyous occasion when students receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time. We rejoice and hope that this special moment in their lives will remain firmly etched in their hearts and memories forever. We are united in Christian love and in the shared hope that these children will be filled with the fullness of God's gifts.

- Timing: 3-4 minutes
- Stance: poised, comfortable, confident
- Topic Interest: Audience attention, appropriate level
- Voice: clarity, variety, loudness, pitch
- Speech Cards: keeping pace, correct usage
- Eye contact/gestures
- Involving audience by using individual personality according to topic.

Three winners will be chosen from our school level final to be held on **Thursday 10th August at 11:00am**. These children will then represent St Angela's at a Cluster Final on **Monday 14th August at 9.30am at St Angela's**. One winner from the cluster will progress to the Semi Final and perhaps the Grand Final following later in the term. This diocesan speech contest is being conducted so that children with a flair for public speaking have an opportunity to use this talent. Good luck to all our Year 6 students. Parents are most welcome to come along and support our students on either of these days as audience involvement is a major part of their speaking process.

During this term, starting this week, information on the "Nine Values for Australian Schooling" will be presented each week in our school newsletter. As you are aware the teaching of "Values Education" has been mandated by the Australian Government. These core values have been identified as including a range of secular and religious world views, and are common to most cultures. They underpin Australian society.

As a Catholic School we teach according to Jesus Christ's gospel values which strongly reflect the values of LOVE, FAITH, HOPE, RECONCILIATION, KINDNESS, SELF CONTROL, GENTLENESS, INTEGRITY, RESPECT and JUSTICE. Below is a summary of the nine values for Australian schooling.

Nine Values for Australian Schooling

1. Care and Compassion - Care for self and others

2. <u>Doing Your Best</u> - Seek to accomplish something worthy and admirable, try hard, pursue excellence

3. <u>Fair Go</u> - Pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly for a just society

4. <u>Freedom</u> - Enjoy all the rights and privileges of Australian citizenship free from unnecessary interference or control, and stand up for the rights of others

5. <u>Honesty and Trustworthiness</u> - Be honest, sincere and seek the truth

6. <u>Integrity</u> - Act in accordance with principles of moral and ethical conduct, ensure consistency between words and deeds

7. <u>Respect</u> - Treat others with consideration and regard, respect another person's point of view

<u>Responsibility</u> - Be accountable for one's own actions, resolve differences in constructive, non-violent and peaceful ways, contribute to society and to civic life, take care of the environment
<u>Understanding</u>, <u>Tolerance and Inclusion</u> - Be aware of others and their cultures, accept diversity within a democratic society, being included and including others.

A key aspect of this ongoing values education is the importance of students developing responsibility, resilience and social skills through co-curricular as well as curriculum programs.

Book Club

Scholastic catalogues were sent home earlier this week. Please see the following details that outline a new process for ordering and for payments. :

St Angelas is in the Loop! Your scholastic order will be electronically linked when you order and pay by Loop -<u>scholastic.com.au/LOOP</u> Or download the app, register your details and follow the prompts. When you order and pay by LOOP do not fill in the order form or return anything to school. Payment options include credit card PayPal or credit vouchers. Please note the school does not accept cash and all cash orders will be returned.

How to Order?

Type the book number on the catalogue and press enter. Example: 102 To change the quantity, tap the text box next to the product name. Enter the de4sired quantity and press update.

To remove an item, enter a quantity of 0 and tap update. Alternatively you can swipe the item to the left and tap remove. This will remove the item from the order.

If you have multiple children on the order, you can change who you are ordering for by tapping the 'children' button on the top right hand corner.

If your school has agreed to allow gift orders, you can mark an order as gift by pressing the orange button marked 'Gift Order'. Simply tap this button again in un...
