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Religious Education

Sunday, 29 Oct 2017: Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Gospel Mt 22:34-40

A lawyer asks Jesus which commandment is greatest.

Like last week's gospel, we again have an example of the Pharisees seeking to 'catch Jesus out' in his interpretation of scripture. The Pharisees were regarded as the great interpreters of the Torah – the Law. To them, ALL the commandments were vitally important, not just the Ten Commandments given to Moses. For the Pharisees to ask Jesus about the 'greatest' commandment was a blatant challenge to him. Perhaps they expected Jesus to name one commandment and then they could challenge him with a whole series of 'What about ...?' questions.

Jesus' answer to the Pharisees is to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind. Jesus reminds them that being faithful to God isn't about following precise rules but rather it is simply about loving God. With this one sentence, Jesus undermines the power position of the Pharisees. If the Law is as simple as 'Love God', what need is there of Pharisees to interpret the details of the Law? Having pulled the rug out from under them, Jesus follows up with his reminder that the second most important commandment is to love your neighbour as yourself. This is a call to compassion and justice that Jesus practised freely but was sadly lacking in the religious authorities of his time.

Q. In your local situation, who are the 'neighbours' not loved as we love ourselves?

Q. What actions can you take to better love your neighbour as you love yourself?

The message in Sunday's Gospel to *love our neighbour as ourselves* is an appropriate theme as we prepare for Mission Week at St Angela's. Next week year 5 will launch their Project Based Learning Initiatives that will raise much needed funds and awareness of the Jesuit Refugee Service.

The **Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS)** is an international Catholic organisation with a mission to accompany, serve and advocate on behalf of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons. JRS programmes are found in 51 countries, providing assistance to: refugees in camps and cities, individuals displaced within their own countries, asylum seekers in cities, and to those held in detention centres. The main areas of work are in the field of education, emergency assistance, healthcare, livelihood activities and social services.

Year 5 students are answering Jesus' *call to compassion and justice* and invite the St Angela's school community to do the same. The Mission Markets will be set up in the playground and hall, Tuesday to Thursday and the children are encouraged to support Year 5's initiatives. (please see the flyer attached for further details) A maximum of \$5 per child in total, for those wishing to participate is to be brought to school on either of the three market days. Students will be given a Mission Market Card which will be marked according to their donation.

Why is my Child's Teacher out of Class?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in areas such as technology. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers also have entitlements such as long service leave, maternity leave, family leave etc., sick leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partner to liaise with the relief teacher so that good teaching and learning continues and routines are kept.

Families with more than one child at school are only required to provide one plate of whichever category they would like to choose. Although we have lots of seating, any additional fold up chairs etc. would be beneficial as we are certainly expecting a large number of visitors. ***If you are able to assist in setting up, serving or packing up, please contact the office or volunteer on the day.***
