A-E Mid Year Reports

Your child will soon be bringing home their Semester One Learning Report. These Reports highlight particular strengths, as well as areas of development for your child.

The A-E style of reporting is mandated by the Government for all grades except Kindergarten (who have a different Reporting scale). *There are no predetermined number of A, B, C, D, E achievement levels to be allocated

*Each Key Learning Area must have an overall achievement level indicated

* It is important to note than this reporting process is not based on a bell curve.

*The overall achievement level is for the whole Key Learning Area (KLA) which may contain many strands. Although some KLA's have been broken into strands, it is important to note that some strands have more weight than others. The overall achievement is not just a straight averaging of strands.

*Comparative data for the grade is included in the reports for Years 1-6.

*The achievement levels / common grade scale are provided by the Board of Studies and included in your report for you to reference.

*Parent/Teacher interviews will be held in Week 10 (Tuesday 2nd July and Wednesday 3rd July) to supplement and further explain reports.

Each year introduces different concepts, content units and skills etc. which can increase in difficulty from the year before. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement level in a particular Key Learning Area may change.

The achievement level of 'C' is awarded to children who have achieved sound knowledge and understanding of work covered in that particular grade at this particular time. It means your child is working and achieving appropriately for their grade. This may be different from the traditional 'C' from our own school days. Our parent/teacher interviews seek to explain, elaborate on and support the Reports. The following website http://arc.boardofstudies.nsw.edu.au/go/k-6/ provides work samples that illustrate A-E Achievement levels. It is well worth a look.

Sunday, 23 Jun 2019: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - (Corpus Christi) - Year C Gospel

Lk 9:11-17

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

They all ate and were filled.

Gospel focus - Give them something yourselves

In the gospel, the disciples encourage Jesus to send the crowds away to find food for themselves. Jesus tells the disciples, "Give them something to eat yourselves." This is a challenge and a test of the disciples – a chance for them to be like Jesus. He calls them to act with compassion and do what he would do to feed the people. But the disciples fail to grasp either his meaning or the opportunity and the miracle is left to Jesus. Jesus believed that they could feed the people if they tried but the disciples didn't have that same faith in themselves.

Notification Policy if Moving from St Angela's

Please note:

If you are leaving St Angela's please ensure you are aware that the Diocese requests a full terms notice, (10 school weeks) in writing, to be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates a students enrolment. According to Diocesan policy, if the required notice is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay one term's school fees including diocesan fees.

Upon withdrawal of a student, fees are calculated on a pro-rata basis according to the notification period given.

One exception is that notice in writing, will be accepted at anytime during Term 4. This is outlined on the last page of your Term 1 school fee account statement and also on the enrolment form instructions.

Bathurst Excursion

On Thursday the 13th of June, until Friday the 14th of June, Year 5 went on camp to the Bathurst Goldfields. On the journey we stopped at Echo Point in Katoomba where we were able to look at the breathtaking views of the Three Sisters and we crossed the Blue Mountains. After we took a few photos, we had our morning tea, took some more photos and then hopped back on the bus to drive to Abercrombie Caves.

When we arrived, Year 5 was astonished with the view. During the bush walk, we went into a cave called The Bushrangers' Cave. The ranger told us that it was called the Bushrangers' Cave because a gang of bushrangers called the Ribbon Gang used to hide out in there, but they got caught. Some of them went back to being convicts and the ten that didn't were hanged. Once we got out of the Bushrangers' Cave, we went to a different cave, which was very dark. There were so many amazing stalagmites and stalactites, it looked like a city! It was also a bit scary because it looked like it was going to crumble on top of us! The caves also had white spots all over the ceiling, but we learnt that all of those white spots were families of spiders.

When we arrived at Bathurst, it was about 4:00 in the afternoon. Our first activity was to look at the 'whim'. The 'whim' was a tool they used to use to pull the heavy pieces of gold out of the ground. It used horses and 2 big barrels. The second activity was the museum. We learnt about the different miners and different valuable gems and stones. We learnt a lot! Once we were done with that, we went to have dinner. Dinner was pasta and fresh hot chips.

After the delicious Dinner, we spent a very entertaining hour line dancing. The lady was impressed with our dance skills. Finally, it was time to go to our rooms to get some rest.

On Friday 14th we had another busy day. Our first activity was a rotation of Aboriginal art and boomerang throwing. After this we experienced the life of a Gold Miner. We learnt how to make damper, which is like bread. We made damper using flour and water and ate it with maple syrup. The Gold Miners lived in tents on the Goldfields, because as soon as the Gold ran out, they packed up and moved to another deposit. On the fields, to mine Gold you had to have a Gold Miners' License and a Claim. If you were found on someone else's Claim mining, the penalty was death.

Year 5 also had the chance to go Gold Panning. We had so much fun and we were exhausted after 2 long days of learning.

Canberra Excursion

We had an informative tour of the House of Representatives and the Senate. Next stop was lunch in the beautiful rose gardens before visiting the Electoral Centre. Here we learnt how people voted, how the votes are counted and the history of Democracy and Federation. The activities taught us about ballot papers, the situation when voting and the order you vote in.

Finally it was time to leave. We headed off and returned to school. Our parents were waiting, excited to see us and hear all the stories we had to tell. What a great excursion!
