Social Justice Statement 2019–2020 Making it Real: Genuine Human Encounter in our Digital World

This Sunday, the gospel from St Luke gives us a clear message of God's preferential option for the poor. Our readings, confront us with inequality and divisions in the world. Then – and now - those who are rich and powerful are warned that God will raise up, protect, and uphold the poor and excluded, bringing about a reversal of fortunes. Things are not what they seem. Today, in our digital world, what appears on the surface to be perfect lives can belie a different reality. The digital platforms themselves may appear to be free and neutral, but they are not. The digital world that connects us as never before is also marked by a divide. The readings call us to reach out in solidarity, respecting, including and caring for our neighbours, whether face to face or in the digital world. Are our online actions characterised by faith and love, patience and gentleness? Do we stand up for the truth when we encounter hate groups, cyberbullying or 'fake news' online?

Prayer for Our Digital World

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Help us to recognise the evil latent in a communication that does not build communion.

Help us to remove the venom from our judgements.

Help us to speak about others as our brothers and sisters.

You are faithful and trustworthy; may our words be seeds of goodness for the world: where there is shouting, let us practise listening;

where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony;

where there is ambiguity, let us bring clarity;

where there is exclusion, let us offer solidarity;

where there is sensationalism, let us use sobriety;

where there is superficiality, let us raise real questions;

where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust;

where there is hostility, let us bring respect;

where there is falsehood, let us bring truth.
