

Lk 18:1-8

In the Sunday Gospel from Luke, Jesus illustrates the need to pray continually through the parable of the widow and the irreligious judge.

REFLECTION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE by Lisa-Marie Calderone-Stewart

Think of any successful scientist, any successful musician, any successful writer. None of these people became successful overnight. It usually takes a lot of time and a lot of mistakes – a lot of close attempts – before success comes. That's true in any area of life.

School Travel Advice

There have been some changes to the Hillsbus afternoon service from St Angela's. A current timetable can be found at http://www.cdcbus.com.au/ or collected from the office. Although children are aware of which bus they now catch, please note the change in bus number for the GREEN bus, from 2509 to 2550 and BLUE bus from 2600 to 2598.

2020 school travel applications now open

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/ updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.
