When we return to school in Term 3, all things going well, we anticipate that we can return to our

In Term 3 we will continue to ask parents to limit visits to the school office - where possible communicate by phone or email. We will also continue

- hand sanitising for all students as they enter school at the commencement of the school day
- regular and routine hand washing throughout the day

While we appreciate and value having our parents onsite to support the learning programmes and activities in the school, all the health advice to school communities, still recommends that schools limit the involvement of parents and the organisation of parent related activities. You would then understand that this impacts a wide range of usual parent activities and involvement eg sports carnivals, grade assemblies, liturgies, and interschool activities involving parents. We will keep you informed as we receive further advice about this and whether some events do take place, however with considerable changes. As always we thank you for your support even if at the moment it is at a distance.

School Hours and Late Arrivals

As we have been transitioning back to school throughout this term the morning assemblies have not been taking place but as you have seen in this newsletter they will be recommencing in Term 3. The Assemblies commence once the children have lined up at the 8:30am bell

You may be wondering why the gates are closed punctually at 8:30am each morning.

The school day at St Angela's commences at 8:30am and concludes at 2:50pm. All students should be up under the Big Top ready to meet their teachers when the bell goes at 8:30am. On the very rare occasion you may be running late and pulling into the Kiss and Drop right on the bell, you will notice that the staff member on duty will be about to close the gate - staff who perform this duty need to move off when the bell goes so that they can meet their class and attend the morning assembly. Mrs Yager and Mrs Nettleton both speak at this assembly, so they too need to be moving to the Big Top once the bell goes.

Please be reminded of the following procedure in the mornings should your children arrive at school after the bell and the staff member on duty has closed the gates. Please accompany your child/ren to the office where you will be able to sign them in and provide the relevant information for partial attendance that needs to be recorded as part of our School Attendance Procedures.

Living the Gospel – Shoulder my yoke

Jesus invites us to shoulder his yoke and learn from him for he is gentle and humble in heart. The yoke he invites us to shoulder is the deceptively simple teaching: love God and love your neighbour. To love God is to consciously make a place in our lives for God. The busy spin that tends to be characteristic of so many people's lives today does not allow room for God; does not allow room for prayer and quiet; does not allow room for compassionate response to others. To love God and love our neighbour we must first make room for them.

Have you thought? Thank God!

Jesus' quite intimate words to the Father in today's passage carry with them an enormous amount of relief and perhaps released frustration. It is almost a cry of 'Thank God!' for his disciples have finally 'got it'. Jesus blesses the Father for revealing the truth to these simple men whom Jesus had chosen to follow him. The men Jesus chose as disciples were not following another rabbi and so had not been the very best students from their village. They had the education of most children but nothing more – otherwise they would have been following someone else!

Thank you everyone for staying connected with the gospel reflections this term, we look forward to sharing them again with you in term 3.



Holiday e-safety

With the holidays about to commence you may find the following 10 top tips for protecting children online helpful:

COVID-19 [Global Online Safety Advice for Parents and Carers](#)

1. Build an open trusting relationship around technology so your child knows they can come to you if something goes wrong or does not feel right online.
2. Co-view and co-play with your child online to better understand what they are doing and why they enjoy an app, game or website.
3. Build good habits and help your child develop digital intelligence and social and emotional skills.
4. Empower your child with strategies to deal with negative online experiences.
5. Use devices in open areas of the home so you can be aware of and manage who your child interacts with.
6. Set time limits that balance time spent in front of screens with offline activities, a family technology plan can help.
7. Know the apps, games and social media sites that your kids are using, making sure they are age appropriate and learn how to limit the messaging and online chat and location sharing functions.
8. Check the privacy settings to make sure your child's profile is set to the strictest privacy settings.
9. Use available technologies to set up parental controls on devices.
10. Be alert to signs of distress and know where to go for more advice and support.
