We look forward to welcoming the children back to school for Term 4 commencing Monday October 12th.



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Religious Education

Sunday, 27 September 2020: Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Gospel

Mt 21:28-32

The man with two sons.

Gospel Reflection



This week's gospel passage is one of many within Matthew's gospel that show Jesus at odds with the religious authorities of his day. The picture of the religious leaders that comes through Matthew's gospel is one of hypocrisy. Jesus is frequently portrayed as criticising the leaders for holding too strongly to the letter of the law and ignoring the spirit of the law and the call to compassion. This week's passage has Jesus seeking the opinion of the chief priests and elders on a hypothetical situation (a common style of debating a point of law in the Jewish tradition). He describes two sons, each asked by their father to go and work in the family vineyard. The first says 'No' but later does his father's bidding. The second says 'Yes' but doesn't follow through on his commitment.

Jesus is criticising the religious leaders of his time who, with their words, said 'Yes' to God but by their actions said 'No'. He most certainly would have upset the leaders by telling them that tax collectors and prostitutes would enter the kingdom of God before them. Whilst these tax collectors and prostitutes were regarded by the religious authorities as 'sinners' beyond redemption, Jesus holds them up in the image of the first son of the story. Although they may have said 'No' to God through their poor choices, ultimately they are saying 'Yes' to God in their acceptance of Jesus and the message of the kingdom of God. On the other hand, the leaders have said 'Yes' to God publicly through abiding by all the religious laws and maintaining a 'religious profile' but in their hearts and actions they have not truly said 'Yes!'

From the perspective of ... A Tax Collector

Hey, Jesus is talking about me again! I love it when he says that I'm better than some of those stuck up chief priests. All my life they've looked down on me; pretending they're better than me. I've seen the way some of them behave when they think no-one's watching! They're no better than me! And Jesus says that people like me will enter the kingdom before people like them! Yes! I know I've done the wrong thing plenty of times – Jesus has helped me to see that. Maybe that's what makes me different from those priests; I don't pretend that I've never done anything wrong.

Living the Gospel – Saying 'Yes!'

In many ways, it is easy to say 'Yes' and not really mean it. Some people do it all the time in their lives. They say 'Yes' when they have no intention at all of following through on their commitment. It's easy to say 'Yes' and not mean it when it comes to faith as well. It's pretty easy to turn up at Church on a Sunday and be seen to be doing the 'right' thing. But if our faith doesn't change the way we live, then maybe we're really saying 'No' to God.

Season of Creation

Pope Francis is encouraging parishes and schools to participate in a Season of Creation, which commenced on September 1 and ending October 4, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi. We are called to prayer, reflection and action towards care of our common home, the planet Earth. This term, Year 1 has focused on learning how we can appreciate and care for creation. Throughout our learning we reflected using Pope Francis' <u>Laudato Si shorturl.at/fvLQZ</u>, a letter he wrote urging us to be responsible stewards of all creation. We have written prayers thanking God for the gift of creation and making a promise to care for our common home.

Student Data Validation

As part of our annual system and legal requirements, Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) is asking families to ensure all relevant contact and student information is up to date and accurate for the purposes of communication and providing relevant support to students.

On Monday 19 October, households will receive an email or SMS from CEDP with a link and login details to the Student Data Validation (SDV) form.

Keeping our school safe in a COVID-19 world Over the past month we have had over 91 students that have been COVID tested. I would like to thank parents for following the NSW Health and Government Guidelines by having this done. A reminder that when the results do come back, we ask that the screen shot is emailed to the school prior to your child returning to school.

- remind the children to routinely and frequently wash their hands and use hand sanitiser
- wipe down touch points in class rooms and toilet areas
- have students learning and participating in class and grade groups rather than across grades
- require students to bring their own drink bottle to school each day
- In Term 4, we will implement any updated guidelines from NSW Department of Health.

2. Co-view and co-play with your child online to better understand what they are doing and why they enjoy an app, game or website.

3. Build good habits and help your child develop digital intelligence and social and emotional skills.

4. Empower your child with strategies to deal with negative online experiences.

5. Use devices in open areas of the home so you can be aware of and manage who your child interacts with.

6. Set time limits that balance time spent in front of screens with offline activities, a family technology plan can help.

7. Know the apps, games and social media sites that your kids are using, making sure they are age appropriate and learn how to limit the messaging and online chat and location sharing functions.

8. Check the privacy settings to make sure your child's profile is set to the strictest privacy settings.

9. Use available technologies to set up parental controls on devices.

10. Be alert to signs of distress and know where to go for more advice and support.
