Important Safety Reminders Around the School at Drop Off and Pick Up Times

Please be reminded of the following:-
School Drop off is from 8:05am.

Back Gate Drop Off

Do not stop your car in the No Stopping Zone in front of the back gates. Apart from this being an illegal use of this area it poses a danger to all pedestrian who use this area.



Front Gate Drop Off

Parents do not get out of the car to assist children - this holds up the flow of traffic.

If your child is unable to get out of the car independently with their bag and close the car door, then please park outside the school grounds and walk your child to the front gate.

When exiting the school there is NO RIGHT TURN.

Afternoon Walkers and Crossers

Teachers and students need time after the bell to make their way to these areas before Walkers and Crossers are brought out of the school grounds.

- Walkers leave the school grounds first: Due to the large number of students who leave as Walkers, parents are now asked to meet these students within the school grounds - just inside the driveway gates. Once you meet your child please leave the grounds so that the Crossers can be brought down next.
- Crossers leave next: Thank you for meeting your children across the road in the Wrights Rd Reserve

Car Pick Up

Please have your name card clearly displayed.

Wait for the Teacher on Duty to commence the entry of cars into the school.

Please do not over take cars in the Kiss and Drop area.

When exiting the school there is NO RIGHT TURN.

Students Riding Bikes

Exit the school with Walkers or Crossers

Parents must have completed and submitted a "Riding Bicycles and Scooters to and from School" permission slip and must wear a Bike Helmet.

COSHC Drop off and Pick Up

Families who use COSHC, park in the school car park before 8:00am and after 3:30pm and drop off and pick up their children using the small electronic gate beside the canteen.

Parking in the streets around the school

We have established very good relations with our neighbours. Please ensure that you park legally and respectfully when parking in neighbouring streets- avoiding driveways and not parking on footpaths or in "No parking" zones.

Thank you for always keeping the safety of our students and families a priority whenever you drop off or pick up your children from school. Thank you to our staff who work with you as they carry out supervision duties as the students arrive and leave the school.

Why is my Child's Teacher out of Class?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to participate in professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time at the beginning of the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the substitute teacher so that good teaching and learning continues and routines are kept. Have You Returned Your Medication Forms and Action Plan?

Thank you to those parents who have returned forms and action plans for children who have medication stored or administered at school due to anaphylaxis, allergies or asthma. If you have not updated your paperwork, could you please do so **as a matter of importance**. If you require forms to be resent, please contact the school office. If your child no longer requires medication to be stored at school, please email stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au and we will remove your child's name from our records. It is essential that these forms and action plans are updated annually by your child's doctor so that our records are accurate and reflect the needs of each individual child. **As noted, it is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child's medication remains current, ie. not expired.** Please note this in a diary or on your phone. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.
