Dear Parente

The Premier announced yesterday that the current restrictions in Greater Sydney will remain in place for a further 2 weeks as a result of the advice from NSW Health. This will mean that students will continue to learn from home until **Friday the 30th of July**.

During this time we will continue to provide Learning Schedules for K-2 using Seesaw and for Years 3-6 using Google Classroom. In keeping with Premier Berejiklian's strong message that everyone who can stay at home should stay at home, we are working to minimise the number of staff on-site at school each day.

Supervision will continue to be provided at school for those families who need this support (essential workers, vulnerable students, or those who are not at home and have no other supervision options). Thank you for carefully considering whether your family falls into one of these categories. The students being provided with supervision at school are completing exactly the same work as the children who are at home and this will continue until lockdown is lifted. Please complete the Week 2 Attendance Form Week 2 Attendance Form ONLY if your child will need supervision at school next week.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the St Angela's school community for the wonderful support that has been given to our staff as they have transitioned face to face learning to remote learning for the children (and parents) as they commenced Term 3. You have been patient and understanding throughout the week and this has been very much appreciated. I would also like to congratulate and acknowledge the great work that parents are doing in their role as "teacher".

Throughout this week all class teachers have endeavoured to contact every child's parent to welcome the children back to school. The teachers have found this to be a wonderful experience as they were able to connect with the students of their class and support their parents.

Attendance

During this lockdown period, if your child is unwell or for any other reason is unable to participate in learning at home for the day, please inform the school via email so that we can record the correct attendance for your child on that day. If your child is attending school on any particular day the school day is as usual 8:30am - 2:50pm. Parents are required to be punctual so that we can manage the students arrival and the need to supervise the students at school with limited staff. Parents are reminded that during lockdown do not walk into the school grounds or into COSHC.

Other than to collect your child if contacted by the school or to collect loan devices, please do not come to the school in person. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we continue to work together to keep our community safe.
