#### Return to Face to Face Attendance at school for Students

The NSW Government has provided the roadmap for students to return to school in Term 4. The teachers have been planning for the return of the students according to this roadmap. This is a staggered return for prioritised cohorts.

According to this roadmap, the school will be staffed in Weeks 1-3 in Term 4 in the same way that it has for this term - providing supervision only for those students whose parents are essential workers or who are not at home and have no other options for supervision of their children. We will continue to ask parents to register their children for attendance at school during this time for the days they need to attend.

As you would expect there will be further information provided about the Return to School Transition process and requirements next term, as more information is available to schools. I appreciate that many parents have questions about vaccinations, whether or not Remote Learning can continue for their children once face to face schooling has returned, and activities and events that can take place at school in Term 4 are just a few of these. As we have this information for you we will communicate it to you.


