"God will carry you safely through every struggle." Mary MacKillop 1870

This Sunday August 8, we celebrate the feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's first saint. Mary MacKillop lived a life where she always put the needs of others before her own. She was born in poverty and then spent her life reaching out to the poor and sick providing them with education. In her time she was known as a radical who challenged the authorities of the day. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today.

Mary MacKillop's love for Christ was so strong that she sought Him out in the poor, sick and suffering and also in the hardships of life. During the current COVID pandemic we can draw strength from her words and her conviction to live her life with an unwavering sense of gratitude and confidence that God would always provide. In her own writings and reflections Mary MacKillop spoke over and over of 'our good God' and she lived with a grateful willingness to receive God's love. At this time when we are searching for answers and solutions we can look to Mary MacKillop's life and her relationship with God to give us courage and strength.

Learning Schedules

The staff is truly appreciative of the positive feedback received from parents and students about the Learning Schedules. Week 5 Learning Schedules will be shared with families at 4:00pm on Sunday 25th July on Seesaw (K-2) or Google classroom (Years 3- 6). Throughout the week if a teacher needs to be offline and unable to provide feedback they will communicate a message to parents via the Google Classroom or Seesaw platforms. These occasions will not interrupt the students ability to continue working on their schedules, they will just mean that for a short period of time the teacher will not be available to provide feedback. Feel Good Friday

From next week, each Friday afternoon we are asking students to go offline at 12:30pm, have their lunch and then engage in some activities that do not require screen time. At this time staff will also be offline. The students at school will do the same. We have introduced this into the programme to allow students, staff and families to invest in their own wellbeing. Throughout this week we have been providing families with resources that make suggestions of activities that you and your children can be involved in away from devices. We urge you to take up this opportunity at the end of each week in recognition of all the hard work that you, your children and the teachers have been doing throughout the week.

Contact from Class teachers

To ensure that you remain connected to your child's teacher and your child's participation in remote learning, class teachers will be calling parents. If you see a call displaying "No Caller Id" this could be your child's teacher and we would appreciate you taking the call.

Attendance

It is a mandatory requirement that teachers record daily attendance of students. During Remote Learning, teachers are monitoring the students engagement with their Learning Schedules and their work submission on Seesaw and Google Classroom so that they can validate students' attendance. If your child is sick or unable to complete class work on a particular day, please inform the class teacher so that their attendance can be correctly recorded as an absence. If the teacher's notice that your child has not engaged in the learning they will be in touch to inquire as to the reason for this and to offer support if needed. 
SAINT MARY OF THE CROSS (MARY MACKILLOP)

Historical Context – Mary MacKillop

Mary MacKillop is not only the first Australian to be recognised by the Church as a Saint, she is truly a very Australian saint. She characterises the spirit of the Australian mythology. She was a prodigious hard worker who put the needs of others before herself. She exhibited something of the larrikin spirit: constantly in dispute with authority but pressing on, regardless. She used the strengths of others but also didn't tolerate those who were not genuine. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today. A Saint for and of Australia!
