From the School Counsellor......

Returning and Starting School- A Note From St Angela's School Counsellor Karina Greenfield

The start of a new school year can be daunting for both children returning to a new grade and those starting kindergarten or transferring schools. Some children may meet this change with excitement and anticipation, whereas others may be feeling overwhelmed and worried. With the continued uncertainty related to COVID-19, children who have traditionally handled change and transition well, might find this year more difficult than previous years. Your child may appear to be enjoying their return or start to school, however may be internalising their worries or may not be able to pinpoint how they are feeling and why. You may begin to notice your child regress in a skill they were previously proficient in. They may be quicker to emotions, be more teary, display anger or more withdrawn. Your child may take these changes in their stride for the first few weeks of term and start to unravel as the term goes on.

It is important to remember that while these behaviours may be out of character for your child, they are not unexpected in the context of adjusting to a new environment and school year. It can also be helpful to acknowledge with your child how physically and emotionally exhausting adjusting to school can be after a break. Other suggestions to assist during this period are;

- Try to get into a regular routine as soon as possible. Consistency and predictability can help children feel secure and settled when starting a school day.
- Allow your children time to talk; letting them take the lead in the conversation. Some children may not want to talk as soon as school is finished but may be more willing later in the evening once they have had time to process the day.
- Give your child unstructured play time.
- Ensure they have the opportunity to get plenty of sleep.
- Check in with how you are feeling as a parent, as this time can be a whirlwind of emotions for all involved and children can learn a lot about emotion regulation through role modelling from their parents.
- Encourage your child to speak to their classroom teacher if they have any questions or concerns throughout the day. While the teacher may be new to your child, they are keen to get to know each child individually and build on those relationships. Open communication between teacher and child, child and parents and parents and teachers are essential to helping a child to thrive at
