#### Sunday, 7 February 2021 - Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Gospel <u>Mk 1:29-39</u>

Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law.

#### **Gospel Reflection**



This week's gospel follows directly on from last week's reading and, as is typical with Mark's gospel, the events occur on the very same day. The urgency of the gospel is obvious in this week's reading; Jesus had a very busy 24 hours! Having launched his public ministry in the synagogue earlier that day, Jesus accompanies his new disciples to meet some of their family and have a meal. However, on arriving at the home of Simon and Andrew, they find Simon's mother-in-law is sick. Unlike the public displays of his healing power that preceded and will follow this episode, Jesus does not say anything but simply takes the woman by the hand and helps her up. Her response of beginning to wait on Jesus and his disciples is a faith response and a recognition of who Jesus is. A theme that runs through this gospel is that the disciples never fully understand who Jesus is. Here, a woman who has just met him recognises him as the Messiah and begins to serve him.

#### Living the Gospel – Prayer

In the midst of an extremely hectic 24 hours where Jesus effectively launches his public ministry, Jesus takes time to go aside to a lonely place and pray. The passage tells us that it was 'long before dawn' that he did this. It may have been his usual practice to pray early in the morning or he may have been restless after the events of the previous day and the thought of what lay ahead. Nevertheless, Jesus provides us with a model of using prayer to reflect on events and to prepare ourselves for the day ahead.

#### **Birthday Treats**

One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and MUST be approved by the child's school. For the child to attend the nominated trial or event, the school approves students based on playing history and selection criteria. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" if applicable to the sport MUST be completed. Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the **2021 CEDP Primary Sport TEAM Registration** Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

#### eSafety's top back-to-school tips:

The start of the new school year can be an emotional day for any parent or carer. The holidays are over, it's time to get back to the serious business of classes and playground games. For some parents there will be tears of sadness that their little one is starting school for the first time. For others, tears of joy that their teen won't be playing music loud enough to shake the foundations of your home. The back-to-school period can also be a great time to review your child's online safety and get ahead of any issues that may come up through the year.

**Watch out for cyberbullying** — online bullying can have a devastating impact on young people, whose online life is a key part of their identity and how they interact socially.

**'Sharent'** responsibly— not heard the term 'sharent'? Well, if you are a parent who shares then that's you! Be mindful about sharing your child's first day of school and other milestones on social media.

**Set screen time limits** — With screens increasingly being used at school and home, it's important to ensure your child has a healthy balance of offline and online time. Setting screen-free zones in the home and negotiating switch off times are useful ways to do this. Screens should never be taken into the bedroom or bathroom. Don't forget, quality over quantity! <u>See more information about managing screen time</u>.

**Use tools**—parental controls on smartphones, TVs and computers can help limit your child seeing inappropriate content and help manage their time online. Make sure the privacy settings on their apps and games are turned on and help show them how to block and report people online. **Stay engaged**—as soon as we hand our child a device, we should be talking to them about the dos and don'ts of the online world. It's also important let them know we'll be there to support them if anything goes wrong. There is no substitute for taking an interest in our children's online lives from an early age, to help establish strong foundations and open lines of communication. #### School Fees 2021

Changes to Family Levy

We advise that your school fee statement may look a little different this year. You will notice that the resource fee has increased and there is no longer a Family Levy as the Family Levy and the Resource fee have merged. In the majority of cases this has little or no impact. For families with 3 or more students, there will be a slight increase in the combination of these fees. For 2021 there will be no increase in diocesan tuition fees or the building levy and therefore you will find that the total school fees increase is within the bounds of normal annual increases.
