PROTOCOLS FOR STAFF OR STUDENTS TESTING POSITIVE TO COVID-19

- \cdot If there is a positive case in a class, year or other grouping, the other students can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice.
- · Staff and students who get a positive rapid antigen test result must register it on service.nsw.gov.au or the Service NSW app as soon as possible.
- \cdot Staff and students who receive a positive rapid antigen or PCR test result must tell their school as soon as possible, and follow NSW Health advice.
- \cdot We will regularly communicate with families and staff about the presence and impact of COVID-19 in our community. If and when your child's year group is impacted by a positive COVID case you will be advised. As you are aware this is important as students from the one year group eat and play together.

At all times we will ensure the privacy of our students, families and staff.

REMINDERS ABOUT SCHOOL ARRIVAL TIMES

School Gates open at 8:05am - supervision commences once the children walk up into the school grounds - Harrington Avenue and Orleans Way.

Car park opens for drop off at 8:05am - please do not enter or park in the Kiss and Drop before this time as it blocks the entry for staff, COSHC families and deliveries.

School Commences at 8:30am with music playing at 8:27am.

Students arriving after 8:30am must be taken to the office area and signed in by an adult.

Thank you for your cooperation with these procedures and working in partnership to assist with the safe arrival of our students to school.



BIRTHDAY TREATS

In 2022, students are able to bring birthday cupcakes, doughnuts or frozen zooper doopers to school to share with their class. If you do not wish your child to receive a cake, donut or zooper dooper, when it is brought in by another student for their birthday celebration please inform the teacher in writing.



The following guidelines taken from the St Angela's Parent Handbook apply to these treats: Some parents like to send a birthday treat to school to share. If you would like to do this, please send individual treats e.g. cupcakes or donuts as these are very manageable, (as opposed to a cake which is difficult to divide). As with all food brought to school, cakes should be nut free. If your child has allergies, you are encouraged to provide an alternate treat, in a labelled container, that can be left at school for them to have on other childrens' birthday celebrations.

Please Note: Due to allergies, we ask that you do not send lollies, chocolates or other treats.

CHANGING GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:30am until 2:50pm and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. Appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made.

We ask that all early departures and changes to going home arrangements are advised in writing to

stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au before 1.30pm on the day the change is taking place.

Please do not email going home changes days in advance.

This assists with our process of notifying the class teacher via their office bag.

ROAD SAFETY IN HARRINGTON AVE AND ORLEANS WAY

The two entrances to our school in the mornings and afternoons require users to take care and be aware. If you are dropping your children at the back gate

- it is illegal to stop in the NO STOPPING ZONE
- the teacher on duty opens the back gate at 8:05am
- take care as you drive through the "Children Crossing" flagged area

If you are driving into the school grounds from Harrington Ave in the mornings to use the Kiss and Drop

- cars enter from 8:05 when the second gate is opened (some parents are entering at 8:00am)
- drivers need to be mindful of parents and children crossing across the driveway on the footpath
- drivers DO NOT get out of the car in the Kiss and Drop.
- children must be able to get out of the car independently in the Kiss and Drop area.

TRAFFIC REMINDERS AROUND THE SCHOOL

Parents are reminded of the Road Traffic signage in Harrington Ave and Orleans Way. It is noticeable in Orleans Way before school that many drivers are pulling up in the NO STOPPING zones to let their children out in the mornings. A NO STOPPING sign indicates to drivers that you **MUST NOT STOP AT ANYTIME.** Council Officers patrolling this area will apply the appropriate penalties and fines for this infringement (Fines from \$311 and Penalty -2 Demerit Points).

Most importantly please be mindful that if you are stopping in these areas you are :

- endangering the students who enter the back gates as you are blocking their access
- causing a traffic jam to the flow of traffic through Orleans Way which includes not only St Angela's parents but our neighbours who live in this street

Thank you for abiding by the Road Traffic Signage and ensuring the safety of road users and pedestrians.

IMPORTANT ALLERGY INFORMATION

At St Angela's we have a number of children who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for some people the reaction can be lifethreatening. This is called anaphylaxis and can occur in minutes of an exposure to a trigger, in these children's case, nuts.

We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these children. So as to support our community's effort in this regard, parents are requested not to send nuts or foods containing nuts to school with their children.

The following list gives examples of such foods.

- Peanuts, hazelnuts, almonds, cashews, macadamia nuts
- Peanut butter
- Nutella
- Biscuits and cakes containing nuts
- Snack packs containing nuts
- Chocolate bars containing nuts eg Picnics, Mars Bars (almond), Nut Breaks and Fruit and Nut chocolates
- Marzipan and nougat
- Breakfast cereals containing nuts eg Crunchy Nut/Honey
 Nut Cornflakes, Muesli, Nutrigrain
- Muesli Bars and snack bars containing nuts
- Yoghurt and nut mixer packs
- Confectionery items such as Lolly Gobble Bliss Bombs and Rocky Road
- Uncle Toby's yoghurt muesli bars

We realise that there may be trace elements of nuts in a variety of other foods. However, if you use the above list as a guide you will be doing your part. Parents can also reinforce with their children that sharing food is not allowed at St Angela's.

SCHOOL AND COMPLAINT HANDLING

At St Angela's Primary School, we strive to build a learning community in partnership with the home and parish, which models relationships based on:

- Mutual respect
- Affirmation and welcoming of individual differences
- Sharing and forgiveness
- Collaboration and support
- Generosity, gratitude and service.

Our community rejoices in:

- Nurturing cooperative relationships between students, staff, parents and parishioners
- Using effective ways to communicate within and across the school community.

At times, issues may arise at school that cause you concern and you would like to speak to someone about these. The following procedures are in place. At all times the dignity, rights and beliefs of all those involved are respected.

- The first point of call is the child's class teacher. Contact the school office via email or written note to the teacher to make an appointment with the teacher concerned.
- If you are not satisfied with the solutions offered or believe that they have not been given a fair hearing you are encouraged to make an appointment with the Assistant Principal or Principal to discuss the issues further.

ESAFETY'S TOP BACK-TO-SCHOOL TIPS:

The start of the new school year can be an emotional day for any parent or carer. The holidays are over, it's time to get back to the serious business of classes and playground games. For some parents there will be tears of sadness that their little one is starting school for the first time. For others, tears of joy that their teen won't be playing music loud enough to shake the foundations of your home. The back-to-school period can also be a great time to review your child's online safety and get ahead of any issues that may come up through the year.

WATCH OUT FOR CYBERBULLYING — online bullying can have a devastating impact on young people, whose online life is a key part of their identity and how they interact socially.

'SHARENT' RESPONSIBLY - not heard the term 'sharent'? Well, if you are a parent who shares then that's you! Be mindful about sharing your child's first day of school and other milestones on social media.

SET SCREEN TIME LIMITS - With screens increasingly being used at school and home, it's important to ensure your child has a healthy balance of offline and online time. Setting screenfree zones in the home and negotiating switch off times are useful ways to do this. Screens should never be taken into the bedroom or bathroom. Don't forget, quality over quantity! USE TOOLS - parental controls on smartphones, TVs and computers can help limit your child seeing inappropriate content and help manage their time online. Make sure the privacy settings on their apps and games are turned on and help show them how to block and report people online. See more information about using parental controls and privacy and reporting tools.

STAY ENGAGED - as soon as we hand our child a device, we should be talking to them about the dos and don'ts of the online world. It's also important to let them know we'll be there to support them if anything goes wrong. There is no substitute for taking an interest in our children's online lives from an early age, to help establish strong foundations and open lines of communication. If you wish to contact your child's teacher, please continue to direct your emails to the school email account which will then be passed onto the relevant teacher, as per our usual practice.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education. NOTIFICATION POLICY IF MOVING FROM ST ANGELA'S

If you are leaving St Angela's please ensure you are aware that the Diocese requests a full terms notice, (10 school weeks) in writing, to be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates a students enrolment. According to Diocesan policy, if the required notice is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay one term's school fees including diocesan fees.

Upon withdrawal of a student, fees are calculated on a pro-rata basis according to the notification period given.

One exception is that notice in writing, will be accepted at anytime during Term 4.

This is outlined on the last page of your Term 1 school fee account statement and also on the enrolment form instructions.

Please contact the school office if further clarification is required. *Thank you*.

MEDICATION INFORMATION

Prescription medication is only administered to students upon completion of St Angela's medication forms, which are available from the school office or on our website under the following pathway:

There are two types of forms:

 Doctor Forms for Prescribed Medication (to be completed by Doctor and Parent)
 If your child requires <u>prescription</u> medication to be

permanently stored for administration at school, ie. Anaphylaxis/Allergies or Asthma, these forms are required to be completed by a parent and your child's doctor.

 Short Term Prescribed Medication (to be completed by Parent)

If your child requires <u>prescription</u> medication to be administered on a short term basis, ie. 1-5 days, please complete this form.

Please note we are unable to administer prescription medication unless the relevant form, as outlined above, is completed. Handwritten notes are not satisfactory for the administration of medication.

All prescription medication for your child must be delivered to and collected from the office **by a parent**. For safety reasons, prescription medication should not be carried by children. All prescription medication is required to be supplied in its original container, clearly labelled with your child's name, the name of the medication, dosage and frequency of administration. Appropriate equipment for administering medication is to be supplied by the parent, eg. Asthma spacer. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure all medication remains current. All medication sent to school is kept in the School Office.

NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Non-prescription medication is not administered by the school, eg. Panadol, antihistamine, creams, ointments, eye drops etc. The only exception to this is if a doctor completes the appropriate abovementioned form.

2022 PRESCRIBED MEDICATION FORMS

Forms and action plans, which are required to be updated for 2022 were emailed at the end of last year to those families whose children currently have medication stored at school on a permanent basis. If you have not already done so, please return the completed forms to the office as soon as possible. Please notify the school via email at stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au if your child's medical requirements have changed and they no longer require medication to be permanently stored at school. We thank you for your attention to this important matter.


