COVID POSITIVE AND CLOSE CONTACT ISOLATION REMINDERS

Anyone who tests positive with a rapid antigen test must:

- register their test result with Service NSW to understand their risk and access support from NSW Health
- <u>self-isolate</u> and follow the <u>NSW Health advice for testing</u> positive.
- If there is a case of Covid positive in your household it is important that all family members follow the close contact rules and self-isolate for seven days. Please let the school know of the absence and when it is expected that they will return.

You are reminded that staff and students **cannot attend school** if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19. These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

RAPID ANTIGEN KITS FOR STUDENTS

4 RAT KIts are being sent home with each student this afternoon to enable students to be tested twice weekly over the next 2 weeks.

KEEPING OUR ST ANGELA'S COMMUNITY WELL AND SAFE

At St Angela's we have members of our school community with compromised immune systems. This means that these individuals are more susceptible to infections and illness than others. It is therefore extremely important that students do not attend school if they are unwell and that the school is informed if any child contracts Chicken Pox, Measles, or flu so that we can keep everyone and most particularly these individuals healthy and safe. With the current pandemic it is extremely important that no child or staff member attends school feeling unwell. Should a child become unwell with cold and flu symptoms, you will be asked to collect your child from school. Thank you for your understanding.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C 13th February 2022

GOSPEL

Lk 6:17. 20-26

The beginning of the Sermon on the Plain (Mount).

Have you thought? - Gospel of prosperity

The sermon on the plain challenges our ideas about happiness and success – particularly those of us who live in a relatively prosperous society. Those who are rich and well regarded are actually condemned by Jesus. This also flies in the face of the so - called Gospel of Prosperity that has gained some prominence amongst Pentecostal churches in the last 20-30 years. This teaching holds that God blesses the faithful with wealth and influence. It doesn't take a lot to see how this teaching is out of step with the gospel blessing of the poor and cursing of the rich.

Gospel Focus – Treated as the prophets

As part of his sermon, Jesus announces, 'Happy are you when people hate you, drive you out, abuse you, denounce your name as criminal, on account of the Son of Man... This was the way their ancestors treated the prophets.' The prophets of the Old Testament were the chosen spokesmen of God. Their message was often unpopular and they were often threatened and berated for challenging the social order. To be treated in this way is in fact something of an affirmation that one's words and actions are reflecting the message of God. The Word of God is confronting and challenging!

2022 SCHOOL FEES

BIRTHDAY TREATS

In 2022, students are able to bring birthday cupcakes, doughnuts or frozen zooper doopers to school to share with their class. Join The Band

Dear Parents.

Enrolments are now open to students who wish to join the school band in 2022. See below for a basic overview of the program.

Band Program Structure

Rehearsal: students work together in a full band setting, generally before or after school (30-60min each week)

Tuition: students work in small groups at school to learn new skills, usually on the same day as rehearsal (30min each week)

Students attend both rehearsal and tuition (weekly) at school.

Regular **practise** at home (3-4 times a week) is essential.

Band Program Costs

Tuition Fees: small group tuition and band rehearsal costs \$195 (plus a \$10 resource levy) per term. Individual tuition costs extra and is not available at all schools.

Instrument: students require their own instrument. TSA sells quality new instruments or offers 'rent-to-buy' starting at \$43 per month.


Accessories: students are provided with a workbook on enrolment but may require other accessories, generally less than \$50 per year.
