Our St Angela's awards presented each week acknowledge those students who have been demonstrating our school and faith based values - respect, compassion, caring, kindness and collaboration. Our Learning Excellence awards recognise academic achievement and effort. Throughout the year, students are also recognised for a wide variety of additional learning engagements - most recently these have included Maths Challenge Awards for the Stage 3 students, Semester One Student Representative Member recognition, Sporting recognition at carnivals and Gala days. On a daily basis within class and grade groups teachers and leaders recognise and award students for the achievement of individual and class learning and behavioural goals. With these awards being presented so regularly throughout the school, the students are encouraged, challenged and motivated to continue to focus on so many aspects of their faith and their learning. It is so wonderful to hear the students and teachers each and every day encouraging each other to "Let their Light Shine" through recognising the diversity and talent within our school community.

### COVID

Families at St Angela's continue to experience COVID cases, so it is important for you to monitor your children for symptoms and keep them at home if they are unwell. We will also contact you if your child feels unwell at school. As it is flu season, please be vigilant about the early signs of influenza which also require you to keep your children at home to ensure that we continue to maintain a healthy environment for the children and staff while at school. Thank you for following the COVID communication protocols below.

### **COVID SAFE PROTOCOLS**

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Therefore we ask that students, staff and family members who visit the school

### Parents are required to:

- inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.
- inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic

## SAFE AND CARING SCHOOL SURVEY

At St Angela's we are committed to providing a safe and supportive school for all our children. This is reflected in the following items from The School's Mission Statement:
