Staff Development Day - Pupil Free Day Tomorrow Friday 26th August

Parents are reminded that tomorrow is a pupil free day with the teachers participating in Professional Learning at school focused on the New English Syllabus which will begin to be implemented in 2023 for students in K-2 and 2024 for students in Years 3 - 6.

In Week 7 we celebrate Family Week when children and parents are encouraged to spend time together without the constraints of the usual homework requirements (although we ask that every child still reads each night). We encourage you to choose an activity that you can do as a family each day with your child. Examples may include playing a board game, sitting and sharing stories, cooking a meal together, feeding the pet, playing cards, helping put away laundry, setting the table, reading mum or dad a book, washing the car, gardening, writing mum and dad a thank you note, spending time in prayer/saying the Rosary, going for a family walk etc. Family Week is aimed at freeing children up to assist and/or spend time with those who love them most, their greatest heroes, you their parents and family.

Children's Work Books Coming Home

Tomorrow, the children will be bringing home their Maths and RE books for you to look through with them. They will have selected a page that they are proud of and would like to share with you. This page will have a yellow post-it note attached to it for your comment. It is important to remember that a lot of the work produced by the infants children involve concrete materials and for the primary students (Years 3-6) is completed using online platforms such as Google Classroom, your child can take you to their google classroom for you to look through it with them. Additionally, we ask that the books be returned promptly the next school day so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book. The children are excited to share their learning with you.

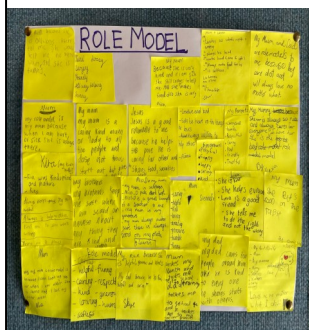

COVID

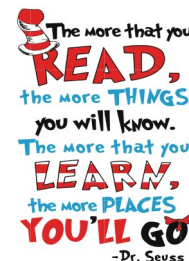

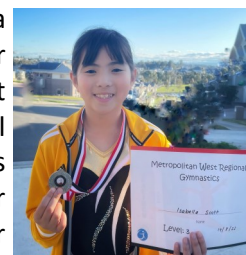

Notification Policy if moving from St Angela's

Please note:

If you are leaving St Angela's please ensure you are aware that the Diocese requests a full terms notice, (10 school weeks) in writing, to be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates a student's enrolment. According to Diocesan policy, if the required notice is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay one term's school fees including diocesan fees.

Upon withdrawal of a student, fees are calculated on a pro-rata basis according to the notification period given. One exception is that notice in writing, will be accepted at anytime during Term 4. **This is outlined on the last page of your Term 1 school fee account statement and also on the enrolment form instructions.**
