PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Over the next weeks of Term Four, two significant transitions will be happening at St Angela's - the attendance at High School Orientation Days for our Year 6 students who will be concluding their education at St Angela's at the end of this year and the attendance at our Kindergarten Orientation days for our incoming 2023 Kindergarten students. As with most things in life we will be celebrating with these cohorts, beginnings and endings. When I talk with our students across the school they all remember with great fondness their first days at St Angela's as one their most significant milestones in their lives. Belonging to the St Angela's community is a partnership between families and teachers. Our teachers are so privileged to be a part of the growth and development of your children and take this role very seriously - our children are such a special gift. Description.

We have chosen the Rainbow Lorikeet as our Totem. We feel we have a connection to the rainbow lorikeet as we sometimes see them in our playground. We would love to see more rainbow lorikeets in our school. We have researched their eating habits and we will be investigating how best to encourage them to St Angela's. We hope to provide them with the environment they need in terms of plants as well as the responsibility we have as stewards of creation to ensure they are not consuming foods that may harm them.

The Rainbow Lorikeet is beautiful to look at as Its kaleidoscopic rainbow colours make it stand out from all the other birds. We love how they glide through the air, looking like flying rainbow! They frequently make the funniest cheeky sounds, like they're chatting to each other. They're bright and cheery and bring a sense of humour to our playground.



The students will continue to learn about our totem over the remainder of this year and next.

At our morning assemblies we have been reviewing uniform expectations with the students. Thank you to parents for helping the children to wear the correct items of uniform to school each day. In Week 5 there will be a Second Hand Uniform sale for parents to purchase uniform items for 2023.

Today, as planned, another demountable classroom was successfully located on the basketball courts. This makes 7 in total. When the time comes, i.e. when all classrooms have been commissioned our current Year 1 and 2 classes as well as the Kinder Blue class will move into these rooms.

Families with more than one child at school are only required to provide one plate of whichever category they would like to choose. <u>Although we have lots of seating, any additional fold up chairs etc. would be beneficial as we are certainly expecting a large number of visitors.</u>

World Mission Sunday - 23rd October 2022

"You shall be my witnesses" – The call of every Christian to bear witness to Christ

This is the central point, the heart of Jesus' teaching to the disciples, in view of their being sent forth into the world. The disciples are to be witnesses of Jesus, thanks to the grace of the Holy Spirit that they will receive. Wherever they go and in whatever place they find themselves. Christ was the first to be sent, as a "missionary" of the Father (cf. *Jn* 20:21), and as such, he is the Father's "faithful witness" (cf. *Rev* 1:5). In a similar way, every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. And the Church, the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. To evangelize is the very identity of the Church.
