All I Ever Really Needed to Know I Learned in Kindergarten by Robert Fulghum

Don't hit people.

Put things back where you found them.

Clean up your own mess.

Don't take things that aren't yours.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Flush.

Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you. Give them to someone who feels sad.

Live a balanced life.

Learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day.

Take a nap every afternoon.

Be aware of wonder.

Remember the little seed in the plastic cup? The roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.

Everything you need to know is in there somewhere. And it is still true, no matter how old you are, when you go out into the world, it is best to hold hands and stick together."

AUSTRALIAN MATHS COMPETITION

This year, as part of our extension Maths program, groups of students from Years 3 to 6 came together each week to solve challenging mathematical problems. The competition *Have Sum Fun Online is run by the Maths Association of Western Australia and is endorsed by Australian Association of Mathematical Teachers Inc. HSFOL is designed to foster mathematical problem solving for all students in Years 3-10 across Australia. The competition provides valuable opportunities to observe students engaging in cooperative problem solving. It consists of three rounds of 10 questions, where competitors have one hour to complete each round of questions. Our students have participated in this competition in Terms 2, 3 and 4.*

Initially, students found collaboration in Maths to be quite a challenge and traditionally, some students thought that Maths is more for the independent learner. But as the weeks progressed students learnt how to trouble-shoot, to find an efficient strategy, to make generalisations, to apply previous knowledge and they even learnt to prove their thinking to a sceptical peer. Each week, students came away having learnt something new to apply to their lessons in class and the following round of the competition. There was plenty of discussion, challenging, negotiating and even arguing happening during their sessions together.

This year, we have had a lot of success in the program, with several teams gaining 100% scores, completing them in record times, and several teams placing in the top 3 in the country. Students were competitive against each other, against the clock and against the league tables. Last term, we saw our Year 3 team place 1st overall, and our Year 4 team place 2nd overall. This is quite an achievement with schools from all over Australia competing.

We look forward to finding out the results of the Term 4 competition next week.
