Parents are reminded that there will be NO SCHEDULED classes tomorrow Friday 27th May due to Industrial Action by the Independent Education Union (IEU). Supervision will be provided at school however, no classes will be held. We strongly encourage families not to send their children to school tomorrow given the reduction in staff. CEDP employees are within their rights to take protected industrial action in pursuit of a new pay deal. At the same time, we appreciate families' concerns about further potential disruption to students and the school community. Year 6 Going to Canberra

Students from our school will soon be undertaking, an education tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid

- Build enthusiasm for the story you're reading.
- Expose him to new words.
- Learn more about his interests.

The teacher says my child needs to become a more *fluent* reader. How can I help her with this?

A *fluent* reader progresses through material with confidence and feeling. Fluency makes it easier for your child to read and understand material. To increase fluency, make sure your child reads often

(even if it's the same material repeatedly). When you read aloud to her, model fluency by reading with clarity and expression.

COVID

Families at St Angela's continue to experience COVID cases, so it is important for you to monitor your children for symptoms and keep them at home if they are unwell. We will also contact you if your child feels unwell at school. As it is flu season, please be vigilant about the early signs of influenza which also require you to keep your children at home to ensure that we continue to maintain a healthy environment for the children and staff while at school. Thank you for following the COVID communication protocols below.

COVID SAFE PROTOCOLS

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Therefore we ask that students, staff and family members who visit the school

Parents are required to:

- inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.
- inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic
