#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Over this term the students and teachers have had the pleasure of hearing so many wonderful speeches from our Stage 3 students. Year 6 students, as you are aware, have recently competed in the Voice of Youth Competition and at the same time our Year 5 students have been preparing and writing Power of Voice Speeches. It is wonderful to hear our students speak so passionately about topics and issues that matter to them and how they believe they can make a difference to the world now and in the future. This week I include for your enjoyment a copy of Zara Fernades' Voice of youth speech "Gratitude"

Look up. What's that? Oh that's right, it's a roof. What did you have for breakfast? A bowl of cereal, maybe toast. What's in your fridge? Food, obviously. For you these may all seem like normal things. But for others they aren't. Some people get nothing but a few grains of rice and some lentils! Sleeping on nothing but a single bed with an unfluffed cushion. A nightmare for some. But for others it's a dream. Not even Mother Teresa, an amazing saint, slept on a proper bed. Just like my great grandmother was. Nana Lillian. She worked closely alongside Mother Teresa touring around India together, to visit the various homes set up by the Missionaries of Charity and to seek donations for the poorest of the poor.

Mother Teresa was full of love and compassion. She dedicated her life to helping others. She was a remarkable saint because she didn't only give the homeless houses. She gave them homes by providing them with endless love and compassion and most importantly hope. Hope for their future. Hope that they no longer have to worry about where they will be sleeping or where their next meal is coming from. Hope that one day they can live a normal life. A life like yours. We have so many things that we take for granted while others barely have anything. So, let's stop being selfish and start helping others. We should all be grateful.

Not only are we selfish, we also consume a lot. The average person uses at least 2 kilos of waste that can't be recycled everyday. That's every single person in this room. Every single person in Australia. Every single person in the world! Clearly we take too much of the earth's resources. Much more than what we need. As a background to Zara's speech:-

Zara's Nana Lilian was a co-worker for the Missionaries of charity and worked closely with the nuns helping them settle into two convents in Kochi, South India in the 1970s. The nuns cared for orphaned babies and also fed and clothed very poor people in the community. The co-workers helped the nuns in their work with the poorest of the poor. The Missionaries of Charity took such great care of the babies with genuine love and care.

Mother Teresa would visit from Calcutta and bring much joy and blessings to the sisters and the co- workers. At meal times she would serve her sisters first and then sit down quietly and eat her meal. She exuded a certain aura which cannot be described. Her appearance and behaviour was always tempered with the utmost humility. She was fond of my grandmother as she trusted her. Mother Teresa was soft spoken and spoke when she had to and the rest of the time she prayed a lot, a rosary always in hand.

Mother Teresa and Zara's Nana kept in touch even after Nana migrated to Australia and the letter that was in the pic was one of their last correspondences with each other as Mother passed away in 1997.

Nana Lilian was awarded the "Pro Ecclesia et Pontiface" from Pope John Paul II for her charity work.


#### **CEDP Education Mass and Mission Markets -**


